

Smithsonian Exhibit **Comes to Barrington Area**

Few Structures in America combine architectural ingenuity, economic necessity and romantic idealism better than the covered bridge. The Smithsonian traveling exhibition "Covered Bridges: Spanning the American Landscape" celebrates these iconic structures and the individuals behind their development through photographs, architectural schematics and models. The exhibition will open at the Barrington Area Historical Society on Nov. 11 and run through Jan. 30, 2008. Admission is \$5 for adults, \$3 for seniors and \$2 for children or students.

'Covered Bridges" was developed by the Historical American Engineering Record, a division of the National Park Service, and the Smithsonian Institution Traveling Exhibition Service (SITES); it is funded in part by the Federal Highway Administration.

Though they first appeared in Europe during the Middle Ages, covered bridges flourished in the United States in the 19th century, where they helped encourage the country's economic development by way of a growing network of roads. The first covered bridge in the country appeared over the Schuylkill River in Philadelphia in 1805, and by the country's westward

Covered bridges grew in popularity



among the general public in the early 20th century and became attractive subjects for artists and advertisers. They appeared in advertisements for everything from tires to thermal underwear, feeding the nation's desire for nostalgia. In some cases, advertisers took their messages to the bridges themselves, creating enormous billboards on both the interior and exte-

Despite their appeal, between 1870 and 1970, 90 percent of the country's covered bridges were destroyed by arsonists, natural causes and progress in transportation. Today only about 750 remain, concentrated mostly in Pennsylvania, Ohio, Vermont, Indiana, New Hampshire and Oregon. Community leaders in these states have recognized their value as a tourist attraction, and they have become symbols

former customers so long as there was no demonstrable business activity by the former employee before the termination of employment. In general, employees may plan, form, and outfit a competing corporation while still working for the employer, but may not commence competition. Corporate officers, however, stand on different footing; they owe a fiduciary duty of loyalty to their corporate employer not to (1) actively exploit their positions within the corporation for their own personal benefit, or (2) hinder the ability of a corporation to continue the business for which it was developed.

In a frequently cited case, an employer filed suit against two former officers who made efforts to start a competing corporation prior to informing their employer of their resignation. The court found against the former officers for breach of fiduciary duty when before their resignation, the former officers solicited other employees to work for them and prepared a business plan that included a potential list of their former employers clients. The former officers also admitted having meetings with the potential clients before their resignation which resulted in the clients entering into contracts with the new company shortly after their resignation. As such,

while employees may plan and form a competing corporation while still employed by their employer, officers may be liable for a breach of their fiduciary duty if they fail to notify the employer that they are forming a competing business while still employed. Prohibited actions include soliciting other employees to work for their competing business while still employed and soliciting business from their employer's customers prior to resignation. Accordingly, any employer or employee is well advised to carefully review all agreements which involve non-compete, nonsolicitation and confidentiality and to carefully consider all actions taken before resignation. Cosmetic Dentistry: Are Your Teeth Getting Short?

Many adults find that their front teeth are wearing down, getting thin or even chipping away. The cause of these problems is not what you eat, chewing ice or those pencils you hold in your mouth. More likely, it is unconscious, usually nocturnal movements of your lower jaw called bruxism or "night grinding". The cause may be that your back teeth do not fit together properly. It may be caused by brain waves or it may even be associated with R.E.M. sleep patterns. There may be headaches, sore muscles or jaw joint pain associated with the tooth destruction from bruxism.

If a long-term solution is desired, proper diagnosis of the type of bruxism that exists is required before your teeth are repaired. This diagnosis may require a combination of a careful history, muscle and jaw joint examination, radiographs, impressions for models, mounting these models on a simulator, a plastic oral splint



that is worn 16 hours a day, or even temporary fillings or provisional restorations.

If all that seems ridiculous, think about the cost of having your front teeth fixed, then discovering that the fillings or crowns frequently break and must often be replaced. If it were my mouth, I would want the careful diagnosis.

Fat Injection

Fat injection is a cosmetic procedure, which uses the patient's own fat cells to fill that same patient's facial lines and creases. Structural fat is harvested or removed from one part of the patient's body (i.e. abdomen, thigh) and reinjected into a facial line or crease. As we all know, softening facial lines and wrinkles helps maintain a more youthful appearance, and fat transfer is a great way to accomplish this look.

Fat injection has been used for many years now, but a new technique for placing the fat (the Coleman technique) gives better, longer lasting results. The old technique involved placing large parcels of fat in an atrophic area. Fat cells are fragile and once ruptured, they would die and be reabsorbed into the body. In addition, the fat cells would need a blood supply to nourish them, and providing enough blood to a large parcel of fat was quite difficult. Using the old technique, the fat would eventually die and the patient would need to return to the office for retreatment every two to three months.

The new fat transfer technique is a simple office procedure done with local anesthesia. The fat is harvested from the donor site and cleaned, and is then injected into the atrophic area using a very small, blunt-tipped, side-port needle. The needle is advanced into the tissue with multiple planes of injection, using a crisscross pattern to fill the area with very small parcels of fat. Small parcels of fat have a much better survival rate than larger parcels of fat because the blood




supply can more easily and effectively nourish a small parcel of fat, making the fat more stable. The Coleman technique softens a creased area with countless, tiny parcels of fat.


Because providing a strong blood supply to the fat cells is much more possible with the new technique, the fat can remain in the recipient site indefinitely. Patients are followed for three months and, if needed, a touch-up injection may be done.

At the Center for Facial Plastic Surgery we have performed this new fat transfer technique for the past two years with very favorable results. At our last survey, only 14% of all patients treated returned for re-treatment, compared to almost all patients using the old technique. The fat is lasting and quite stable. Downtime is minimal and recovery includes bruising and swelling, which usually resolve within five to seven days.

Buy Firewood Locally

can be purchased from individuals, dealers or retail stores, or many people cut their own firewood. However, a new pest to the northern Illinois area should encourage persons using ash wood as firewood to use local sources of the wood. The emerald ash borer beetle has been found in several communities in northern Illinois over the past year.

The Illinois and U.S. departments of Agriculture are working with communities and industry to try to control the spread. The emerald ash borer only affects ash trees. Since the borers do not typically travel far on their own, reducing human transport of the pest can help slow the spread of the problem. Areas identified with the emerald ash borer are officially quarantined to restrict the movement of wood, wood products and the borer. The Illinois quarantine area includes the 18 northeastern-most counties of the state.

"One of the major helpful things that individuals can do to help reduce the spread of the pest is to use local firewood," says John Church, University of Illinois Extension Educator, Natural Resources, Rockford. Don't bring in firewood, or other ash wood products, from infested areas or

The firewood season is here. Firewood from a long distance. If camping in infested areas, leave unused firewood at that site. If buying ash firewood for the winter, be sure of its source.

When purchasing firewood, or other ash products, be a good observer. The borer lays eggs in the bark of the tree and when the borer hatches, it will tunnel under the bark and start feeding on the sapwood of the tree, leaving serpentine trails shallowly under the bark. Also, small Dshaped holes in the bark are also a clue, which are left by adult beetles leaving the sapwood. No other insect creates the BBsize D-shaped holes on ashes.

Evaluating wood or trees prior to cutting for these exit holes is important as it is one of the signs of infestation. Peeling back the bark may also give an indication of trails and borer larvae.
