"Einstein"—Exhibition Brings to Life the Scientist, the Activist, the Man

If there is one word that embodies the aftermath of love. Here we find a young spirit of Albert Einstein (besides "genius" of course), it has to be "engaged." Whatever he was doing-playing the violin, fighting for civil rights, raising money to build a Hebrew University in Jerusalem or changing our understanding of how the universe works—he was never less than fully committed to the project at hand.

Einstein's deep and multifaceted engagement with the world stands out in a remarkable new exhibition-called, simply, "Einstein"—that takes a comprehensive look at the 20th century's most famous scientist: his life, his passions, his science. The exhibition brings to light Einstein's contradictions and accomplishments and clarifies his abstruse theories in innovative and compelling displays. Above all, "Einstein" shows us that even the most complex science is a fundamentally human enterprise, and that even the most revered scientists are complex human beings

The exhibition opens at Chicago's Field Museum Friday, Oct. 17, and will be on view through Sunday, Jan. 4, 2004.

Einstein Comes of Age

Many people feel they know Einstein, the kindly genius with expressive eyes, a halo of unruly white hair and perennially rumpled clothes. There is truth in that image and a larger-than-life bronze statue embodies it for a new generation of children, who will have a chance at this exhibition to curl up in Einstein's lap. But it's just one of many truths revealed through an array of personal possessions, photographs, film footage, handwritten letters and more.

For example, visitors will get a glimpse of Einstein as a child and of his family life in late 19th century Germany. They'll learn how young Albert chafed at any form of regimentation, though there's also a report card showing that he did do well in school. They'll see a puzzle game he played with, discover how a small magnetic compass sparked his early fascination with the laws of nature, and learn about an early "thought experiment" in which he imagined himself riding a beam

The exhibition also shows Einstein as an avid, articulate and self-revealing correspondent. He wrote to children and to and to lovers. All are represented here, in-

man full of hope and eager for romance, but also prone to disappointment and capable of meanness.

"I think visitors will be surprised to discover how passionate Einstein was," says Robin Groesbeck, manager of Exhibition Coordination at The Field Museum. "Love was obviously very important in his life, and it was important for him to be intensely engaged both with women and with science. He was as passionate about one as about the other.

The Scientist Makes His Mark

Einstein was only 26 and working fulltime in the Swiss patent office when, in his spare time, he wrote and published four papers that revolutionized our understanding of the universe. His papers established the existence and sizes of molecules; described light as both particles and waves; showed that the speed of light is constant while time and space are relative; and set forth the famous equation E = MC². In that one miraculous year, 1905, Einstein changed the face of science and with it, all our lives. Among other consequences, these papers paved the way to the computer revolution, helped unlock the secrets of DNA and laid the groundwork for unleashing atomic energy.

Pages from a 1912 manuscript on special relativity and from Einstein's 1916 masterwork, the general theory of relativity, are on display in the exhibition-and it's truly awe-inspiring to see this work in the scientist's own hand. But equally impressive, visitors will discover that Einstein's core ideas are really not too complex for the rest of us to understand.

Using irresistible interactive displays, computer simulations and animations, compelling light sculptures and even science fiction films, the exhibition succeeds in making abstract and counter-intuitive ideas concrete. Visitors will see and hear how time slows down for moving objects. They'll touch the components of the famous equation and understand how a penny could power a city. They'll bend the fabric of space-time in a demonstration of Einstein's radical concept of gravity, and they'll create that most mysterious of objects, a black hole.

"The exhibition does a great job of clariheads of state, to friends and colleagues, fying and distinguishing the special and general theories of relativity," Groesbeck cluding a selection of love letters and the notes. "It brings scientific theory into three-dimensional space, really engages people in the process, and lets them walk away with an understanding they didn't have before.'

The Humanitarian Takes an Active Role

While many people know that Einstein was a Zionist-he actively campaigned to establish a Jewish homeland in the Middle East and a Hebrew University in Jerusalem-fewer are aware of the broad reach of his political and social activism. He was a lifelong pacifist and socialist who believed that only a unified world government could put an end to war. He was an activist for civil rights and nuclear disarmament, who stood up to McCarthyism and became a target of the FBI. He did not hesitate to use his fame to work for the causes he believed in.

"That's one of the reasons we respect Einstein so much," Groesbeck points out. "He wasn't only a scientist making ground-breaking discoveries, he was also actively engaged in the political and social problems of his time. His feet were firmly planted on the ground."


Einstein's political and humanitarian activities are movingly highlighted in the exhibition. Visitors will also see how he struggled with some of his ideas-for example, when his pacifism ran up against the horrors of the Holocaust. On display is a copy of Einstein's 1939 letter to President Roosevelt alerting him to the possibility of a new type of weapon. Einstein was concerned that the Nazis might be developing an atomic bomb; in his letter to Roosevelt, he urged the president to

accelerate the U.S. atomic research program. After the bombing of Hiroshima, he came to regret his action.

Visitors will also see a less well-known letter from Abba Eban to Einstein, offering the scientist the presidency of Israel. It is testimony to the deep connection Einstein had with his Jewish identity and the Jewish people. Although he declined the offer, visitors may contemplate what might have come of such a presidency.

Tickets to "Einstein" must be purchased in combination with a basic admission ticket.






Song Birds of Bateman Flock Together

This means an employer may legally terminate an employee for a good reason, bad reason or no reason at all. 

For instance, the agreement may specify that the employer may only terminate the employment relationship upon mutual agreement, advance notice or for specified reasons of "cause." Importantly, an employment agreement can provide that the employer pay severance either in a lump sum or over time to further provide protection to the employee upon separation.

Alternatively, the employment agreement can also be used by an employer to restrict your future employment. Facelift Surgery

"The Quilts of Gee's Bend"

The Milwaukee Art Museum will host the nationally popular exhibition "The Quilts of Gee's Bend" now through Jan. 4, 2004. A recent New York Times review praised the quilts, saying they are "some of the most miraculous works of modern art America has produced" and are "so eyepoppingly gorgeous that it's hard to know how to begin to account for them." The exhibition was dubbed "the most ebullient exhibition of the New York art season" while on view at the Whitney Museum of American Art. The Milwaukee Art Museum is the first museum in the Midwest to host the exhibition.


Women in the isolated community of Gee's Bend, Ala., engaged in the traditional art of quilting for generations, motivated by the need to keep their families warm. "The Quilts of Gee's Bend" celebrates these unsung artists for their innovative use of materials and bold command of design. The 70 quilts in the exhibition provide a rare look at a group of 45 20th century artists whose use of motifs, techniques and textiles both change and endure over the course of the century. Through special conservation efforts, the nationally touring exhibition makes these quilts accessible to American audiences for the first

Gee's Bend is an all-black community located in southwest Alabama on a Ushaped sliver of land five miles long and eight miles wide, bounded by a big curve in the Alabama River. Camden, the county seat, is located 10 minutes south, directly across the river, but ferry service was discontinued in 1965 as a backlash to residents taking part in civil rights marches. Ferry service has not yet been restored despite a campaign begun in the last few years to bring it back. "Benders," as residents are called, are an hour's drive from Camden and Selma to the northeast, an hour's drive from supplies, schools and medical services.

The quilts in the exhibition represent four generations of artists who took fabrics from their everyday lives-corduroy, denim, cotton sheets and well-worn clothing—and fashioned them into compositions that more closely resemble modernist abstract paintings than familiar quilt from their mothers or grandmothers, but tion. the emphasis was always on individuality, on innovation. The Gee family sold the plantation to Mark Pettway in 1845. Most of the people who live in Gee's Bend today are descendants of slaves on the former Pettway plantation. Their forebears continued to work the land as tenant farmers after emancipation, and many eventument in the 1940s. Isolated geographically, the women in the community created quilts from whatever materials were available, in patterns of their own imaginative

Gee's Bend became known for its quilts, briefly, during the civil rights movement in the mid-1960s when the Freedom Quilting Bee was organized. Many quilters in the community represent second-generation quilting within a family. Today, quilting is a dying art in Gee's Bend. No quilters are working on a regular basis, and Arnett only knows of one woman under 60 who makes more than one or two quilts a year.

In addition to the quilts, the exhibition will present an in-depth history of Gee's Bend, contemporary and historical photographs of the community—it was photographed by Arthur Rothstein and Marion Post Wolcott in the 1930s for the Resettlement Administration Program—and excerpts from interviews with 30 quilters. I discussed the advantages and disadvantages that lasers and digital X-rays have brought to the dental profession. This month, I would like to review color-scanning technology.

Have you ever seen someone with a cap or crown on their front tooth and could tell from a mile away that it doesn't match their other teeth? Until just recently, dentists had to use little colored shade tabs and try to figure out what color porcelain the dental laboratory should use when making the new crown. Unfortunately, this left a lot up to the interpretation of the dentist or assistant and very often was wrong. Teeth appear to be all one color but actually have multiple bands



and layers of different colors. Communicating these subtle nuances to the lab was virtually impossible. Often times, the patient had to visit the lab so the technician could attempt to match the porcelain of a new crown to the rest of the patient's

Now there is a new technology called ShadeVision. The system works with the same technology that matches paint color. The ShadeVision scanner is placed over the tooth and records color data. That data is e-mailed to the dental laboratory, and they use it to make a perfectly matched crown. They can even scan the crown they made and check it against the measurements provided by the dentist. This technology eliminates the guesswork and provides the patient with a well-matched, natural looking crown.

The Metropolitan Museum of Art houses the most comprehensive collection of art in the Western World. In 1866, John Jay, diplomat, lawyer and grandson of America's first chief justice, said it was time for a national art gallery. William Cullen Bryant chaired the founding committee and sought assistance from leading New Yorkers. The museum opened in temporary quarters in 1870. Calvert Vaux and Jacob Wrey Mould were hired to design the first building with an entrance facing Central Park. The Fifth Avenue façade and great hall were added in 1902.

In 1938, The Cloisters in Fort Tryon Park opened as a branch of the Metropolitan Museum of Art. It is devoted to art of the Middle Ages and includes fragments from various cloisters and other medieval buildings.


Fourth Annual Senior Fair




