



Dates Set for Barrington Safety Town and Registration

The Barrington Junior Women's Club is pleased to announce Safety Town 2009


Safety Town will be offered June 15 through 26th and July 13 through 24th. During the two-week sessions, children attend classes Monday through Friday for 21/2 hours each day at Health World in Barrington. Two class times are offered during each month: 9 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. to 3 p.m. Registration begins April 18.

Safety Town is an educational summer program sponsored by Barrington Junior Women's Club. During each session, a variety of important safety lessons are taught through participation and demonstrations. Safety topics include pedestrian, motorist, fire, bicycle, water, poison, electrical, animal and playground safety as well as stranger danger. Children also review their address and phone number and how to properly use 911 for an emer-

An integral part of the program is the Safety Town permanent site at Health World, built in 1997 through community support. This miniature town allows children hands-on experience using safety information taught in the curriculum. Movies, songs, poems, as well as field trips to a local park and to the Barrington Public Safety Building to visit the police and fire departments are included to help children enjoy and understand the important lessons. Small group attention and building friendships are special program aspects.

Children entering kindergarten or first grade who have not previously participated are eligible. The Safety Town enrollment fee for campers is \$100. Scholarships are available based on financial need.

Safety Town registration will be held Saturday, April 18 at the Barrington Public Safety Facility for students residing in the 60010 ZIP code or eligible to enroll in School District 220. Mail-in and online registration will be available on Monday, April 20. All mail-in registrations will be

a person with supervisory authority over the employee, a state or federal regulatory or law enforcement agency, a member of Congress, a court or grant jury, the head of a federal agency, or an inspector general information that the employee reasonably believes evidences: gross mismanagement of an agency contract or grant relating to stimulus funds; gross waste of stimulus funds; substantial and specific danger to public health or safety related to the implementation or use of stimulus funds; abuse of authority related to the implementation or use of stimulus funds; or violation of a law, rule, or regulation that governs an agency contract or grant related to stimulus funds.

The McCaskill Amendment prohibits a broad range of retaliatory employment actions, including termination, demotion, or any other discriminatory act, which includes any act that would dissuade a reasonable person from engaging in protected conduct. To prevail in a whistleblower action under the McCaskill Amendment, an employee need not show that the protected conduct was a significant or

stead must merely prove that the protected conduct was a contributing factor to the reprisal. A prevailing employee is entitled to make whole relief, which includes, reinstatement, back pay, compensatory damages and attorneys' fees and litigation costs. Where an agency files an action in federal court to enforce an order of relief for a prevailing employee, the court may also award exemplary damages. In sum, the McCaskill Amendment provides a critical safeguard against fraudulent spending of stimulus funds.

Last, but not least, after a brief warm-up, stretching should be performed for all of the major muscles. Hold each stretch for 15 to 60 seconds while breathing naturally.



The Aging Eye—Part II

According to the American Foundation for the Blind (Living with Vision Loss), vision loss impairs not only activities like your ability to read, write, and drive, but also in some cases your ability to live independently, raise a family, maintain or start a career, and enjoy a normal social life or recreational activities. Luckily, it has been proven that regular visits to your eye care professional greatly decreases your chances of such vision loss. Especially for individuals over the age of 40, the need for annual eye exams becomes even more significant as age-related disorders such as cataracts and age-related macular degeneration, amongst many other types of complications, can gradually lead to complete blindness.


Studies conducted by the University of Washington Department of Ophthalmology (Statistics on Blindness and Blinding Diseases in the United States) found that 5,500,000 individuals in the United States suffer some type of visual impairment due to cataracts. Possible causes for this disease are long-term ultraviolet or radiation exposure, diabetes, hypertension and aging amongst others. Studies have found that wearing sunglasses regularly can actually help reduce your chances of developing cataracts by protecting your eyes from prolonged ultraviolet exposure. The most distinct symptom of cataracts is a cloudiness of the eye, which is the result of changes in the eye's proteins. Although cataracts currently holds the reputation of the number one cause of blindness in the world (National Eye Institute,



Prevalence and Causes of Visual Impairment and Blindness Among Adults 40 Years and Older in the United States), extremely effective treatment methods for cataracts exist such as the surgical removal of the cloudy lens. However, if left completely untreated, cataracts can progress and eventually lead to blindness.

Almost as common is age-related macular degeneration (AMD), which is the leading cause of vision loss amongst Americans age 60 and over. According to the National Eve Institute (Age-Related Macular Degeneration), factors that increase your risk of developing AMD are: family history of AMD; age; smoking; obesity; race—Caucasians have a higher affinity of developing AMD than other races; and gender-females are a higher risk than males. AMD is characterized by blurred
