#### **United States Supreme Court Expands** Claims of Retaliation by Joette S. Doran, Esq.

The United States Supreme Court recently issued a decision holding that an employee who is interviewed during an internal investigation of another employee's complaint of sexual harassment may be able to sue for retaliation even where the employee did not initiate the complaint. In Crawford v. Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County, Tennessee, 129 S. Ct. 846 (2009), the Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County, Tenn., began investigating rumors of sexual harassment by the Metro School District's employee relations director, Gene Hughes. In connection with the in-



vestigation, a human resources officer asked employee Vicky Crawford whether she had witnessed any inappropriate behavior on the part of Hughes. In re-

sponse, Crawford described several instances of harassing behavior by Hughes. Although the employer took no action against Hughes, it fired Crawford after an investigation contending she engaged in embezzlement. Crawford sued under Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, claiming that Metropolitan Government fired her in retaliation for reporting Hughes behavior during their sexual harassment investigation. Prior to the investigation, Crawford had not complained about Hughes' behavior. The question before the Court was whether Crawford had opposed an unlawful employment practice (sexual harassment) sufficient to support a claim of retaliation when she had not instigated or initiated any complaint, but instead had only answered questions by investigators in an already pending internal investigation. The Court held that the retaliation protection offered by the opposition clause of Title VII does extend to "an em-

ployee who speaks out about discrimination not on her own initiative, but in answering questions during an employer's internal investigation." This decision affirms that all employees questioned as part of an internal investigation should be afford the same protection against retaliation as those making the actual complaint.



## **Are Your Teeth Getting Short?**

Many adults find that their front teeth are wearing down, getting thin, or even chipping away. The cause of these problems is not what you eat, chewing ice, or those pencils you hold in your mouth. More likely it is unconscious, usually nocturnal movements of your lower jaw called bruxism, sometimes called "night grinding." The cause may be that your back teeth do not fit together properly! It may be caused by brain waves, or it may even be associated with R.E.M. sleep patterns. There may be headaches, sore muscles, or jaw joint pain associated with the tooth destruction from bruxism.

If a long-term solution is desired, proper diagnosis of the type of bruxism that exists is required before your teeth are repaired. This diagnosis may require a combination of a careful history, muscle and jaw joint examination, radiographs, impressions for models, mounting these models on a simulator, or even temporary fillings or provisional restorations.

### Dr. James Baird Addresses **Common Foot Problems**

Don't let your aching feet keep you out of the action this summer. Dr. James Baird is a local Podiatric Physician and Surgeon and is now accepting new patients in his Barrington office. Below are a few common problems and suggestions from Dr. Baird to keep your feet healthy all year long.

I am in the middle of training for a half marathon but am having pain in the ball of my foot.

The pain in the ball of your foot is most likely a capsulitis or neuroma. Both are caused by overuse and possibly linked to recent changes to your workout such as increased mileage or a change in terrain. Your footwear may also be responsible for

Replace your running shoes every 400 miles and ensure that your daily dress shoes offer adequate cushioning in the ball of the foot.

Try cutting back on your mileage, and start icing the area for 10 minutes immediately following your runs and twice more throughout the day. A complete biomechanical evaluation and the addition of custom orthotics may be beneficial to keeping you pain free.

When I get up in the morning, I can barely walk because my heel hurts so

What you are experiencing is something called plantar fasciitis. It is an inflammation of the band of fibers that run from

your heel to toes. While you are sleeping the band begins to repair itself in a relaxed position. First thing in the morning, when you put pressure on the foot, the newly repaired fiber stretches and causes pain. This is a common condition and can usually be treated with a conservative care regimen of icing, stretching, anti-inflammatory medication, and arch support. If not addressed, this can become a chronic condition that may require noninvasive Shockwave therapy or surgery.

#### I have a spot on my toenail. What can I do to get rid of it for summer?

A spot on the nail could be evidence of recent trauma or it could be the start of nail fungus. Nail fungus is a common problem today. We are all exposed to fungus in our daily lives and if you have a small trauma to your nail, it may make you more vulnerable to developing a nail infection. A fungal nail infection can be diagnosed with a simple nail culture in the office and treatment consists of topical or oral medication. Recently, I have had great success with a new topical medication when applied twice daily to
