George L. Hans, 74, of 203 North avenue, a lifelong resident of the Barrington community, died Wednesday morning at Sherman hospital in Elgin when he had been a patient since Feb. 17. He was in good health and worked as a carpenter until last Nov. 4 when he was stricken by illness. Born March 28, 1874, on a farm on Lemie Grove road, Mr. Hans was one of a family of eight children of Mr. and Mrs. David Hans, early settlers in this area. He retired from farming in 1915 and with wife and children moved to the North avenue address. Mr. Hans was a member of Barrington Salem church, Odd Fellows lodge No. 856 and Local 2014, carpenters union.

Surviving are the widow, the former Mary Link; a son, Harold Hans of Lake Zurich; two daughters, Miss Irene Hans, society editor of the Courier-Review, and Mrs. C. C. (Dorothy) Sherman of Barrington; two grandchildren, Linda and Scott Sherman; a brother, David Hans, of Des Plaines, and a sister, Mrs. Matt (Lillian) Wagner of Graylake.

Funeral services will be held at 2:30 o'clock Saturday afternoon from the funeral home at 149 West Main street, with the Rev. John N. Ester of Salem church officiating. Burial will be in Evergreen cemetery.
