Fiscal Year Ends In Six Weeks—Parish Faces Large Collection Deficit Will You Help?

ith just six weeks remaining in our fiscal year, ending June 30th, the existing year-to-date shortfall in total collection income (from weekly, Christmas and Easter contributions combined) is over \$36,500.00. And, with the advent of warm weather, and based on prior experience, we can expect to see a decline in weekend Mass attendance—and an accompanying further decline in collection income. The existing and predicted shortfall in parish income will place us in a difficult financial position as we enter into the summer months when Mass attendance and collections traditionally fall substantially short of the annual weekly budget requirement. Thus, the size of the current shortfall—together with an expected increase in the school subsidy—places the parish in a very tight financial position at the onset of the summer months (at the time when we hope to implement certain needed maintenance and improvement projects).

How can you help improve this situation? If you are reading this article, you are likely a regular supporter the parish. It is difficult to ask that you be even more generous in your weekly offering—however, any extra contribution that you are able to make is

much needed, and will be greatly appreciated. We do ask that if you are going to be away for a weekend Mass that you make an extra effort to turn in your contribution envelopes for any missed week. Also, you might also remind your parishioner friends (particularly those that are less frequent weekend Mass attendees) that our parish could certainly use any extra financial support at this time.

Our parish, like many in the area and across the nation, continues to experience a decline in regular attendance at weekend Masses. This unfortunate national trend which began several years ago has negatively impacted our collection income only in the past few years. Fortunately, many of those parishioners who continue to regularly attend the weekend Masses have increased their contributions. Unfortunately, the increased giving from our regular supporters has not been sufficient to offset the shortfall that is largely the result of the decline in weekend Mass attendance. In the coming weeks, I hope to share more information with you regarding the financial challenges that our parish and the Church in general faces -and some possible solutions to these problems that might be considered.



Reflections

What We Receive We Return to God

I think one of the most interesting images we have in the Old Testament is that of Moses conversing with God on the mountain while the people below were worshipping a pagan image. It is a striking commentary on the human condition that deserves our attention and reflection.

I like to compare this image to one that might be similar to ours in 2007. We have tremendously good people and even great saints in our lives who are at this moment communing with God and carrying out God's work with heroic love and devotion. However, most of us just go on about our own lives without much thought about these amazing people. Even their stories and pictures on TV don't really strike us. Perhaps we simply believe that they are on their own mountaintop; we are in our valley, and the two situations have nothing to do with one another.

It is so possible for us to become complacent and indifferent in being aware of the closeness of God to the human situation. Like the Israelite people in Moses' day their deliverance from slavery was quickly attributed to their own handiwork. When things are going quite well in our lives, we do the same. Maybe we can say that our "golden calves" are our careers, talents and our intelligence among many other gifts. Too readily we believe that all that we have is the secret of our own doing, and ultimately our own success.

For the sake of Moses the people were spared and not disowned by God for their ingratitude. This is the source of our hope and our inspiration. Those holy people around us make life better for all of us. We owe them our thanks, and we have a responsibility to follow the path of true wholeness ourselves.

Let us be aware this week that in giving everything we have back to God, we acknowledge the truth that we have received everything we have from God!

Acts of the Apostles 15:1-2, 22-29 (USCCB)

¹ Some who had come down from Judea were instructing the brothers,

"Unless you are circumcised according to the Mosaic practice, you cannot be saved."

² Because there arose no little dissension and debate by Paul and Barnabas with them, it was decided that Paul, Barnabas, and some of the others should go up to Jerusalem to the apostles and presbyters about this question.

Then the apostles and presbyters, in agreement with the whole church, decided to choose representatives and to send them to Antioch with Paul and Barnabas. The ones chosen were Judas, who was called Barsabbas, and Silas, leaders among the brothers.

²³ This is the letter delivered by them:

"The apostles and the presbyters, your brothers,

to the brothers in Antioch, Syria, and Cilicia of Gentile origin: Greetings.

²⁴ Since we have heard that some of our number who went out without any mandate from us have upset you with their teachings and disturbed your peace of mind,

12 It had a massive, high wall, with twelve gates where twelve angels were stationed and on which names were inscribed, the names of the twelve tribes of the Israelites.

¹³ There were three gates facing east, three north, three south, and three west.

¹⁴ The wall of the city had twelve courses of stones as its foundation, on which were inscribed the twelve names of the twelve apostles of the Lamb.

John 14: 23-29 (CCCB)

²⁶ But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything, and remind you of all that I have said to you.

²⁷ "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you.

Living Story

I do not give it to you as the world gives it.

Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not be fearful.

²⁸ "You heard me say to you,

'I am going away,' and 'I am coming to you.'

If you loved me, you would rejoice that I am going to the Father,

because the Father is greater than I.

²⁹ And now I have told you this before it occurs, so that when it does occur, you may believe.

Once again, the psalm refrain is a key to the Sunday readings:

O God, let all the nations praise you.

In this passage from Acts, Luke tells his story of the early church during the period when actual apostolic witnesses to Jesus were still alive; here he describes the very divisive struggle between gentile converts and Jewish converts. The Jews insisted that the gentiles, who were culturally far removed from the practices of the Jews, should nevertheless be required, as essential to salvation, to observe all the ancient laws of Moses. Paul and Barnabas, leaders of the gentiles, take their concerns all the way to the mother church in Jerusalem for arbitration. This pericope omits the description of the extended debate but the end result is harmony. The Jerusalem church sends two of its own members, Silas and Judas, back to Antioch to accompany Paul and Barnabas, to authenticate the link between Jerusalem and outlying Antioch. They are to say definitively that gentiles do not require circumcision nor are they to observe Mosaic Law except for whatever provisions that the Jerusalem church - together with the holy Spirit (v.28) - deemed essential (v.29). Luke is careful to emphasize that it is the Spirit that guides and directs the church and therefore, harmony and accord is the result. O God, let the nations praise you becomes more intelligible; recall that God himself had demanded that the Israelites understand that the plural, nations are those outside the tribes of Israel.

The second reading from Revelation of course is about the end times. It shows the very intimate connection to the scriptures of the Jews as it describes the Church as the heavenly city of God. In the New Jerusalem, the new city of God, the Father and the Lamb are overwhelmingly present. Therefore, there is no need for a physical Temple. The Church, that is, the body of believers, forms the new temple (vv. 22-23). Recall that the risen Lord is present in the smallest of gatherings (Mt. 18:20) as well as when the entire church (Mt. 28:20) is gathered.

Christ reflects the Father's glory. Isaiah proclaimed it at 60:1ff, 19ff that God's glory would outshine any other light: (Rev 21:23).

The pericope from John is part of the Last Discourse of Jesus to the disciples before he leaves them. At 14:15-17, Jesus had said that if one loved him and kept his commandments, the Father would send another Advocate to dwell with them forever. In a second promise, at 18-21, he reminded them he would leave them, but would return, and would dwell in them as they would in him, and this was possible because the Father was in him. This intimacy is explicit in today's passage: Those who love me will keep my word, and my Father will love them, and we will come to them and make our home with them (v.23). This is the farewell gift of peace: the indwelling of the Father and the Son. This is the teaching that the Holy Spirit will bring to the ones left behind (v.26.)

O God, let all the nations praise you.

So What? It is a very comforting image to think of the Father and Jesus making a home within us and our being kept secure by the constant teaching of the holy Spirit. It is really a kind of peace that cannot be found anywhere in the world! But what do we make of the opening of verse 23?




