A letter was read by Commander Neal from the Lake Forest Post No. 264, asking support for James Manning, candidate for the office of Supervisor. A letter was also read from the Preliminary Hospital Planning Committee, Box 575, Lake Zurich, which requested our attendance at a meeting to be held on January 5 at 7:30 p.m. at the Roslyn Road School in Barrington, at which a Mr. Hiram Sibley, Executive Director of the Hospital Planning Council, will present, "Should There Be a Hospital in Southwest Lake County?" Our cooperation for this worthwhile cause is requested.

Bob Johnson reported that the Department dues have gone up 50 cents. At the present time this will not be costly to the Post, but next year this will cost the Post \$95.00 unless our local dues are raised. This question will have to be resolved. Commander Neal also stated that the Post should look ahead to how many members we have with over fifty years' service, as it is customary to present these members with a lifetime card.

Charles Brown brought up the subject of our Seal or Sign of the American Legion being posted at the town limits. It was noted that the Rotary group and Lions' group now have signs posted.
