# Drs. Kotz, Skopek & Spiekerman X-Rays in Dentistry

There has been recent concern about overexposure to radiation. Excessive doses of radiation have been linked to wrinkles, birth defects, sterility, and even a panoramic film some forms of cancer.

By definition, x-rays are a form of electromagnetic radiation similar to visible light, but having shorter wavelengths. William Roentgen discovered x-rays more than 100 years ago. In 1895, Dr. Otto Walkoff made the first dental radiograph. A radiograph is a photographic record of an image produced by the transmission of x-rays through an object. In dentistry, xrays pass through the tissues of the oral

The development of x-rays for dental diagnosis has continually improved with

There are three basic types of intraoral (in the mouth) radiographs that are utilized in general dentistry. The periapical "PA" lends examination of an individual tooth and its supporting structures (bone, ligament, nerve), and aids in diagnosing pathology.

The interproximal "bitewing" is useful in detecting caries between the teeth. It reveals areas of initial demineralization and active decay. The occlusal film allows for evaluation of a specific area of the maxilla or mandible, and is helpful in determining if a bone fracture is present.

may have been taken. This type of extraoral radiograph is commonly utilized by orthodontists and oral surgeons as a valuable supplement to the intraoral radiograph. It shows crucial structures not visible on intraoral films like the nerve canal and temporomandibular joints. It is also useful in detecting cysts

Our office adheres to ADA recommendations and standards regarding dental radiography. We protect all patients from receiving unnecessary radiation by utilizing lead aprons with collars. The lead absorbs radiation and the collar protects the thyroid gland. We also use double pocket ultra fast speed film. Faster films reduce exposure time, which reduces the amount of radiation that reaches the tissues and the second film provides you with a copy for your insurance without additional exposure. Bitewing radiographs are updated annually, and a complete set is taken only once every four years. This allows our records of your dental health to be current and complete.

Facial Plastic Surgery, Looking Your Best by Gary S. Churchill, MD

Humans have a unique capacity to express emotion through facial expressions. Unfortunately, when we do this, we form expression lines where our skin repeatedly folds. Over time, and with the accumulated damage of sun and other environmental factors, these expression lines become permanent creases. There are a few different options available to lessen the depth of these creases. Collagen injections have been available for years and more recently fat injections and Gortex insertion have become popular. While these treatments provide very nice results, there are some potential problems with them. About 1-2% of the population is allergic to Collagen, and the improvement obtained with Collagen injection will completely dissipate within six months. Fat, on the other hand, never causes an allergic reaction, however, enough of it will dissipate in six months so that a series of injections are required to maintain the correction. Gortex is the same material that artificial blood vessels are made of and it is well tolerated by human tissue. Nevertheless, this is a permanent implant that when placed beneath the skin has a small potential of rejection and can sometimes be felt beneath the surface. While all of these have been used with excellent results, the search for an ideal filler has continued. An ideal filler for creases would be a material that is easy to insert, becomes incorporated by the tissue without risk of rejection and maintains its correction permanently.

There is now such a filler available. Alloderm was used for about five years as a grafting material for burn victims before being approved for use in soft tissue augmentation (or building up). Alloderm is actually the substructure of human dermis. All the cells have been removed and it is freeze dried. After being rehydrated, Alloderm is cut into small strips which are

threaded beneath the crease of the skin through two small needle holes. The insertion sites disappear in a few days and patients can usually resume normal activity almost immediately. At first, the Alloderm can be felt beneath the skin, but over a few month's time, the Alloderm becomes part of the patient's own tissue as cells grow into the area. As this happens, the Alloderm can no longer be felt and a very natural soft feeling is obtained. Alloderm is usually inserted beneath the skin after injection of a local anesthetic. We have used it in frown lines, smile lines and lips. It has also been used in nasal reconstruction and scar improvement. There will no doubt be new uses for Alloderm as time goes by. Alloderm is not currently being used for the very fine lines around the eyes. This is still better treated with laser resurfacing. While some may prefer Collagen, fat or Gortex, it's nice to have an added option for reversing the signs of aging. A consultation is required to determine which filler is best suited for an individual patient.



# The Safest and Most Effective Way to Remove Unwanted Fat

Liposuction is the most commonly performed cosmetic procedure in the United States and there is a good reason why. The reason is the modern "tumescent" technique of anesthesia.

American dermatologists and plastic surgeons learned liposuction from French physicians and brought the procedure to the US in the early 1980's. At first, the procedure was characterized by a number of shortcomings.

#### Why Do I Have Space Between My Front Teeth? by Drs. Michael Hayward & Robert Skopek

Spacing of the front teeth is a major reason why patients, and particularly adult patients, are motivated to seek orthodontic treatment. Frequently, they hope a simple removable appliance or cosmetic bonding from their family dentist will provide an immediate and uncomplicated correction of their problem. Sometimes this is true, however a thorough diagnosis of the factors contributing to the spacing is essential to the success of the treatment, and this will usually require a multidisciplinary approach.



# Parents—for Better Grades, **Build Children's Self-Esteem**

Parents are their children's first teachers, and continue to have significant influence on a child's learning throughout life. A major result of what parents teach children is the child's self-image.

According to Dr. Raymond J. Huntington, founder and president of Huntington Learning Centers, "Parents have a dramatic influence in shaping a child's self-image. If you help your child feel capable, your child will come to believe in

Dr. Huntington offers the following suggestions:

#### Set high, but realistic, expectations.

Your children will strive to live up to your expectations. But be careful—if your expectations are unreasonably high, your child may not be able to meet them and will feel like a failure.

#### Focus on the positive.

Talk with your children about how proud you are when they try something. When a child brings home an assignment, focus on the questions answered correctly rather than the ones answered incorrectly.

#### Help children learn from their mistakes.

When children are unsuccessful at something, indicate that it's a temporary setback, not a failure, as long as they learn something. What stopped them from succeeding? How can it be avoided next time?

#### Give children a special place to display accomplishments.

The refrigerator door is ideal. When friends and relatives visit, share the special items and let your child feel successful. You can also start a scrapbook of your children's accomplishments.

#### Help your children set goals.

By accomplishing goals, children feel successful. You can help break down "big" or long-term goals into manageable steps, and help your child monitor progress. This teaches children how to plan and how to manage time. Praise every attempt, whether successful or not.

#### Give children responsibilities at home.

Having responsibilities gives children a sense of importance and participation. Being relied on to perform a necessary task increases a child's self-esteem.

"For children to believe they can succeed, it's vital that their parents believe they can succeed," Huntington adds. "If parents focus on every 'good try' children will be more likely to keep trying. If a child feels good about himself and has a good self-image, he won't shrink back from a challenge out of a fear of failure. He will continually strive to do his best."


