





One of Japan's Foremost Architects

The work of one of Japan's most prominent living architects is the focus of Japan 2000: Kisho Kurokawa on view in The Art Institute of Chicago's Kisho Kurokawa Gallery of Architecture (G. 227) now through January 3, 1999. Kisho Kurokawa is the third and last exhibition in the Art Institute's 1998 "Japan 2000" series on that country's recent architecture and design. The exhibition reviews Kurokawa's built and theoretical work over 40 years of architectural practice.

Thirty-eight projects are represented by drawings, photomurals and models both standard-sized and miniature as well as a computer terminal exhibiting the same material shown on Kurokawa's website. Included are the famous Nakagin Capsule Tower in Tokyo (1969-70); the Sony Tower in Osaka (1973-76); the Kuala Lumpur International Airport (1994-98); and the new wing of the Vincent Van Gogh Museum in Amsterdam (1997-98).

Kurokawa attracted attention, in part, because of his role as a founder of the influential Metabolism Group, an architectural movement that recognized the continuous process of creation and destruction and conceived of buildings and cities in terms of organic growth. Underlying



What Can be Done About **Prominent Ears?**

Ears can be made less prominent through an operation known as otoplasty. This consists of creating deeper folds in the cartilage of the ear to reposition it closer to the head. It is accomplished through an incision in the crease behind the ear so no scars are visible. The operation can be done on one ear or both depending on the need. It is done as an outpatient with minimal discomfort. A soft bandage is worn over the ears for one to two days. An elastic headband is also worn around the ears for the first week and at night only for another week following surgery. Most people are comfortable going back to work or school within a week.

At What Age can this Surgery be Performed?

This surgery can be performed on children or adults, but the ideal time is about 5 to 6 years of age. By this time the ear has grown to 90% of its adult size and is almost children are entering school and correcting the ears will prevent teasing and nicknames from their schoolmates.

What if One Ear Lobe Sticks Out More Than the Other?

The ear has three main areas that are corrected. The upper portion is generally corrected by making a new fold in the ear's contour. The central region is corrected by flattening the ear closer to the bone behind the ear. The ear lobe is cormost completely formed. This is the time rected by reducing the amount of skin behind it, causing it to flatten. Art Associates to View "Julia Cameron's Women"

Julia Margaret Cameron's portraits of women in the 1860s and 1870s are the subject of a current exhibition at the Art Institute of Chicago. On Thursday, January 7, the Barrington Community Associates of the Art Institute will sponsor a bus trip to view "Julia Cameron's Women" after attending a lecture by Jeff Nigro. Cameron is recognized as a pioneer in the field of photography and as a great portrait photographer. She began her career at age 48 and died at age 63. Although she created many portraits of important intellectual figures in the 19th century, most of her work deals with women she knew well. Cameron took dozens of photographs of her favorite model, Julia Jackson, who was Cameron's niece and the mother of Virginia Woolf. Other models included housemaids, her daughterin-law, and Alice Liddell—the inspiration for Lewis Carroll's Alice's Adventures in Wonderland.

While most photographs of the day were small, full-length portraits of the sitter showing no emotion, Cameron chose to zoom in and use dramatic lighting with her subjects. Tax Planning for Year-End

December is here and the close of December brings the start of the new year. It is hard to believe that another year has come and gone. It is time again to begin to think about tax planning for the 1998 season. The tax law changes of 1997 and 1998, while complicated, offer opportunities for tax savings. This month, I will discuss a few of the major changes for you to consider in your year-end planning.

Capital Gains Rates

In the IRS Restructuring and Reform Act of 1998, Congress included a reduction in the holding period for capital gains property from over 18 months to over 12 months for the maximum 20% capital gains rate, (10% for taxpayers in the 15% bracket). This change is retroactive to December 31, 1997

Gift Tax Planning

The Taxpayer Relief Act of 1997 increased the lifetime applicable exclusion amount from \$600,000 in 1997 to \$625,000 in 1998 and \$650,000 in 1999. It will have incremental increases until the year 2006 when the exclusion will be \$1,000,000. If you do not give this amount away during your lifetime, then upon your death, the exclusion amount will not be subject to estate taxes. If you have used up the \$600,000 exemption in prior years, you may want to use the additional \$25,000 available in

Annual Gifting

A simple method to reduce the value of your estate while shifting income to those in a lower tax bracket is to utilize the \$10,000 annual gift tax exclusion (\$20,000 for split gifts between spouses). If you write a check which does not clear until after December 31, the gift will still qualify for the annual exclusion if the donor was alive when the check was paid by the drawee bank and the check was deposited, cashed or presented to the bank in the same year the donor is seeking the gift tax exclusion. Remember, a gift tax return is required if you take advantage of split gifts. A return is not required if each spouse makes his or her own annual ex-



clusion gifts.

Gifts to Charity

This is a wonderful time of year to remember those less fortunate than us. If you decide to make a charitable gift, remember to write a check in the full name of the charity, make sure the charity has tax-exempt status from the IRS and get a receipt for any donation equal to or greater than \$250, which will be needed to file with your income tax return.

On June 30, 1998, the charitable deduction for the fair market value of publicly traded securities given to private foundations expired. But for this rule, the contributions of appreciated property are valued at the donor's basis.

IRA Deductions

Beginning in 1998, homemakers may take up to a \$2,000 deduction for contributions to their IRA. The deduction is subject to a phaseout of Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) between \$150,000 and \$160,000.

Roth IRAs

Contributions to the new Roth IRAs will phase out the AGI between \$95,000 and \$110,000 for those filing separately, between \$150,000 and \$160,000 for those
