



#### "Rembrandt's Journey" Comes to the Art Institute of Chicago

the most creative and celebrated artists in history. "Rembrandt's Journey: Painter, Draftsman, Etcher" is the first American exhibition with significant national and international loans to explore the full range and variety of Rembrandt's work as a printmaker, particularly as etcher, in the context of his paintings and drawings.

With more than 200 works representing all periods of his long career-approximately 20 paintings, 30 drawings, 150 prints and seven copper plates-the exhibition draws upon public and private collections from around the world, including The State Hermitage Museum (St. Petersburg), the Rijksmuseum (Amsterdam), the Berlin Museums (Berlin), The British Museum and The National Gallery (London), The Metropolitan Museum and The Pierpont Morgan Library (New York), and the National Gallery of Art (Washington, D.C.). The exhibition also features a full 40 works from the Art Institute's own notable Rembrandt collection.

As one of the most imaginative printmakers of all time, Rembrandt had a deeper commitment to expressive etching than any other painter of the 17th century. "Rembrandt's Journey" highlights the parallel relationships between the master's paintings, drawings and prints-closely examining imagery, narrative content and Sunday are \$15.

Rembrandt van Rijn (1606-1669) is one of the marks of the artist's hand. The exhibition, which will be on view through May 9, focuses on several of the subjects to which Rembrandt returned during various stages of his career. These include: Rembrandt's profound and insightful treatment of biblical narratives from both the Old and New testaments; his lively spectrum of highly original self-portraits in etching, drawing and painting; portraits and fantasy portraits; his keen-eyed observation of daily life, including his fascination with beggars and street people; the male and female nude; encounters between the sexes; and his fresh, influential conception of landscapes. Rembrandt's choice of subject matter was unusually wide, and his art demonstrates a Shakespearean mixture of moods ranging from earthy comedy to somber tragedy.





#### Facial Plastic Surgery, Looking Your Best · by Gary S. Churchill, MD

**Evelid Surgery** 

"The eyes are the windows to the soul!" Eyes are one of the most expressive features we have and reveal a lot about us. Subtle changes in their appearance let people know if we are happy, sad, well rested, or tired. We are able to "read" people and at the same time be "read" by others through our eyes. Many have found that an energetic, youthful appearance can enhance others' perceptions of their performance at work. If their eyes look half closed due to excess upper eyelid skin or have "bags" beneath them because of excess fat bulging from beneath the lower eyelids, the overall appearance is one of tiredness and lack of energy. Even when they get plenty of sleep they can still look tired. Many people just feel younger than they look and would like to improve their overall appearance.

These are some of the reasons that a large portion of the cosmetics industry is devoted to enhancing the appearance of our eyes; through makeup, anti-aging and rejuvenating creams. Cosmetic companies realize that a first step in improving our looks is to improve the look of our eyes.

How Do the Eyes Change as We Age? The effects of aging are usually seen first in our eyes. As we get older the skin of the upper eyelid tends to increase and become redundant. This can hide the smooth skin just above the eyelashes where women wear eyeshadow. If enough excessive skin forms, it can actually hang over the eyelashes and obstruct vision. There can also be bulging of fat from behind the eyelid, causing a fullness or discreet bulge in the middle corner of

In the lower eyelids the first sign of aging normally seen is a bulging of the orbital fat creating the puffiness most people refer to as "bags". This is caused by a relaxation of the septum, a membrane beneath the eyelid muscles, which allows the fat of the eyesocket to bulge out beneath the skin. This relaxation is a normal consequence of aging but can occur in young people as a family trait. As pressure is applied to the closed eye one can see this bulge increase. Excess skin of the lower eyelid can also form but not usually to the same degree as in the up-

opens this results in a normal crease approximately 7mm above the lash line. Excess fat, if present, is removed with the skin to reduce the fullness of the upper eyelid. The incision line is closed precisely at the crease to hide it during the healing process. Eyelid skin heals very rapidly. Special techniques are used in Asian eyes and selected others to create a more prominent crease.

In the lower eyelid an incision is made just beneath the lashes or in selected patients on the inside of the lower eyelid. The excess fat, which is contained in three separate compartments, is then removed. Any excess skin is removed taking care not to place too much tension on the lower eyelid.


An upper and lower blepharoplasty can be performed together or in combination with other facial rejuvenation procedures such as a facelift or rhinoplasty. The eyelids can also be improved in certain individuals with chemical peeling and/or brow lifting. The need for these are determined at the preoperative consultation.

Where is Surgery Performed? Eyelid surgery is most often performed in our office surgical suite, however if preferred, surgery can be performed at a number of different hospitals or ambulatory surgery centers in the area.

What is the Recovery Period?

Dissolving sutures are used in the lower eyelids and do not have to be removed. Nonabsorbing sutures are normally used in the upper eyelids and are removed on the fifth postoperative day. Makeup can be worn the day following suture removal and most people return to work at this time. There can be swelling of the eyes for one to two days following the operation which might interfere with vision so we recommend not driving until the swelling is down. After this most people can easily be out in public with sun-In the upper eyelid excess skin is reglasses. 



#### Protecting Your Legal Rights— Illinois Enacts the Victims' Economic Security and Safety Act by Joette S. Doran, J.D.

The State of Illinois has enacted the Victims' Economic Security and Safety Act (VESSA). The act provides that employers (defined as the State or any agency of the State, any unit of local government or school district, or any person that employs at least 50 employees) may not discharge or discriminate against an employee who is a victim of domestic violence or who has a family or household member who is a victim of domestic violence, for takpaid leave from work during any 12- lence. VESSA prohibits employers from complaint with the Illinois Department of ton Area Professional Women.


discharging, discriminating or retaliating against a person taking leave from work as a result of domestic violence to seek medical attention or counseling for injuries or psychological trauma, obtain victim services, relocate, seek legal assistance, or participate in a related court proceeding.

The act provides that the employee shall provide the employer with at least 48 hours advance notice of the employee's intention to take a leave of absence, except where it is not practical to provide such notice. If an unscheduled absence occurs, the employer may not take action against the employee if the employee provides certification within a reasonable time after the absence. While the employer is not required to provide paid leave under this act, the employer may not suspend group health plan benefits during the leave period. An employee may en-

Labor within three years after the alleged violation occurs. The department has the power to conduct investigations and award damages including lost wages, employment benefits, reasonable attorney's fees and costs. As such, if you believe you are entitled to protection under the act. you are well advised to review the facts and circumstances surrounding the situation with legal counsel. 

Raised in Aurora and now residing in Champaign, Dutka started "getting attention" for her drawings in the third grade and went on to get her bachelor's of fine arts with a minor in French at Illinois Wesleyan University. She studied printmaking at Atelier 17 in Paris, and earned her master's of fine arts degree from the University of Wisconsin, Madison.

Now mother of Sophia, who is eight months old, Dutka devotes her weekends to her craft while her husband cares for their daughter. Her hope is that viewers of her images find her work "aesthetically pleasing and conceptually intriguing."

#### **Ninety Years of Photos of Life** Along North Michigan Avenue

A new photo exhibition, "Chicago's Magnificent Mile-90 Years in the Making,' presents images depicting 90 years of life along North Michigan Avenue. The exhibit features street scenes, holiday celebrations and window displays, as well as the evolution of this world-famous boulevard. Running now through March 31, the exhibition is on view in City Gallery in the Historic Water Tower, 806 N. Michigan Avenue, itself a landmark featured in the exhibition.

"Chicago's Magnificent Mile—90 Years in the Making" is sponsored by the Greater North Michigan Avenue Association in celebration of its 90th anniversary, in partnership with the Chicago Department of Cultural Affairs Public Art Program.

Approximately 60 black-and-white and color photographs that show the area through the eyes of photographers were drawn from sources not generally available, to create an intimate, candid portrait of North Michigan Avenue's changing people, places and events. "Chicago's Magnificent Mile-90 Years in the Making" was curated by Kenneth C. Burkhart, former curator of the Chicago Department of Cultural Affairs, and consulting curator of "Chicago in the Year 2000" and "Here is New York."

Photographs from the early 20th century were selected from a remarkable collection of original glass plate negatives made by the staff photographers of the legendary Chicago Daily News, now held in the collection of the Chicago Historical Society. The identities of the individual photographers—and often the subject of the news stories for which the images were originally created—have been lost. But the images offer glimpses of everyday life from the 1910s and 1920s, such as one 1929 photo that shows contestants in a bicycle race lining up in front of the Water

Many surprises were found in the Greater North Michigan Avenue Association's own archives. Their eclectic photographic

holdings ranged from a 1917 view of a tree stump being removed for the widening of North Michigan Avenue to a 1954 image of Christmas decorations on the Water Tower and the Palmolive Building by the noted Hedrich-Blessing studio. Also featured are a series of streetscapes and aerial views that provide startling "beforeand-after" comparisons.

Many photographs were drawn from the critically acclaimed "Chicago in the Year 2000" project that documented life in Chicago in the year of the millennium. Chicago photographers Russell B. In 1947, the boundaries of service were extended and the name was changed to The Greater North Michigan Avenue Association. Today, their mission is to preserve, promote and enhance one of Chicago's most unique neighborhoods, Chicago's Magnificent





Homeopathic remedies are chosen by how closely they match your symptoms. Try Nux Vomica if you have nausea and vomiting, stomach pains and symptoms that worsen when exposed to smoke and

There are several other things you can do to prevent or limit the severity of motion sickness symptoms. For example, driving or sitting in the front seat are the best positions in a car. Also, avoid visual stimuli such as reading or watching videos while traveling. When on a boat or a plane, stay in a central location where your eyes see the same motion that your body feels.
