Splendors of China's Forbidden City: The Glorious Reign of Emperor Qianlong



Emperor Qianlong and Woman Hunt Deer-Emperor Qianlong, ruler of China for 60 years during the Qing dynasty, was recognized for his skills as a hunter and as a warrior. This is the only painting in Chinese history to show an imperial female engaged in hunting or any other athletic activity. The woman aiding the ruler in a dramatic deer-hunting scene is a mystery, although there are tales she is one of Qianlong's daughters or one of his 40 wives.

It was the largest empire the world has ever seen, stretching from the Siberian forests to the South China Sea and from the mountains of Tajikistan to the island of Sakhalin, north of Japan. Its resourcesin gold and jade, in rice and silk, in livestock, land and priceless art-made it richer than all of Europe combined. And at its zenith, it was led by one man who held absolute power over 300 million subjects for 60 years.

This was China in the 18th century under the emperor known as Qianlong. At the heart of the empire was a walled palace complex: The Forbidden City, axis of the universe, pivot point of the four directions, where the "Son of Heaven" lived and ruled.

Today The Forbidden City is Beijing's Palace Museum, a repository of China's national treasures. And now The Field Museum brings to Chicago nearly 400 of those treasures—many never before seen outside the Palace Museum—to tell the story of Qianlong and of life as it was lived behind the palace walls.

The exhibition, Splendors of China's Forbidden City: The Glorious Reign of Emperor Qianlong, will be on view through Sunday, Sept. 12.

In carefully crafted environments drawn from actual palace settings, visitors will have an opportunity to view the elaborate, gold-lacquered Dragon Throne from which the emperor ruled; the desk he worked at and the table where he dined; an imperial consort's chamber; and the emperor's memorial throne, with the tablet said to enshrine his spirit. Throughout the exhibition, an extraordinary range of objects will be on display, including jade carvings and ceramics, statues of gold and bronze, imperial dragon robes, hunting gear and weapons, elegant calligraphy and musical instruments, and extraordinarily detailed paintings by Qianlong's court artists who included several Jesuit missionar-

Qianlong, Man and Emperor

Qianlong was a man of many talents and interests: a brilliant, hands-on administrator; a hard-working bureaucrat; a skilled military strategist and diplomat; an expert bowman; a dedicated scholar and poet; and a patron, collector and critic of the arts. He was a man of deep feelings, both personal—he was deeply in love with his first empress, writing poems about her long after her death-and religious-he practiced the Tibetan form of Buddhism even while supporting his country's other major religions.

"It's important to remember that Qianlong was a Manchu, an ethnic minority from the northwest corner of China, ruling over a much larger majority of Han Chinese," points out Bennet Bronson, the Field Museum's curator of Asian archaeology and ethnology. "He was determined to maintain the Manchu identity without alienating the Han. He understood that this was a delicate balancing act, and he put a lot of effort into maintaining it, sometimes by blurring and other times by accentuating the differences.'

The exhibition examines some of the keys to Qianlong's remarkable success: his tours of the empire to review public works and offer tax relief; his deft intertwining of the symbols and practices of Han and Manchu culture; and his own enjoyment of both "macho" Manchu activities and the more intellectual life of the Han. Qianlong loved the outdoor life and was an expert horseman and hunter (and, notably, admired these skills in women as well as men). At the same time, he was intensely involved in traditional Chinese arts like calligraphy, encouraged innovations in ceramic technology and jade carving, and created a library containing virtually every work of Chinese literature. All of these aspects of Qianlong's life are explored in the exhibition.

consorts—wives of various ranks—who also lived within the palace walls with their children, the wives of former emperors, maids and eunuch servants. During the day, the complex also filled with guards, government officials and other workers. The exhibition gives a vivid picture of what life was like for the royal family—especially the women.

"This was an extremely hierarchical society," Bronson says. "To take just one example: in the exhibition, you'll see a dining room setting where Qianlong might have eaten with two of his wives. Each of them had their own table, in a specified position according to her rank. Wives of each rank also ate from dishes with specific patterns and colors.'

Some say the palace women were only "birds in gilded cages." Certainly their activities and relationships were tightly restricted. But here and there—for example, in a painting of a young woman on horse- outlets.

"We hope this exhibition will stimulate more scholarship on palace history," says Chuimei Ho, a China expert and adjunct curator at the Field Museum. "There hasn't been a lot in the United States-not the way there is on Chinese political and social history. But the work we and others have been doing has already spurred scholarly interest, and we expect to see more conferences and publications as a

Protecting Your Legal Rights— Retaliation

The federal and state statutes which protect your legal rights from discrimination, such as Title VII (race, color, religion, sex or national origin), the Age Discrimination in Employment Act (40 years of age and older) and the Americans with Disabilities Act, also contain provisions prohibiting an employer from taking adverse action against you for making a complaint or filing a charge of discrimination. For instance, if you complained of sexual harassment against your employer, it would be illegal for your employer to take any adverse action against you, including discharge, but is not limited to a reduction in pay or benefits, suspension, interference with job duties and responsibilities, or other hostile actions. It is also illegal for an employer to retaliate against you if you have supported another employee's claim delay receiving information regarding of discrimination.

The federal and state agencies which handle claims of discrimination also handle claims of retaliation. 

Established in 1979, Woodland Art Gallery is the area's most respected and knowledgeable expert of collectable art featuring works by many of today's most





One of the Last from a Mohawk Great

Mohawk carver Stan Hill once said. "My work makes me fully realize that life is a circle. Even though we cannot see life, [it] does not mean it isn't

Stanley Hill was a quiet man who told his stories by carving moose antler that he would bring into the reservation from Newfoundland. His work has been featured in National Geographic Magazine and has been included in many impressive collections, including that of the late president John F. Kennedy.

Back in 1978, he was featured in a demonstration of bone carving at the Field Museum of Natural History in

Focus on Rhinoplasty

"It's as plain as the nose on your face."

This old adage says a lot about this central feature of our anatomy. Occupying the middle third of the face, probably no other single feature can so dramatically affect our appearance. The nose determines to a great extent the balance and symmetry of our faces. If one's nose is out of proportion to the rest of their features, it can dominate their looks. Someone who doesn't like their nose can focus on it, becoming self-conscious and insecure. A change in the appearance of their nose can make all the difference in the world to them. This is why rhinoplasty surgery is one of the most common plastic surgical procedures being performed in the United States today.

What is rhinoplasty?

What is a septoplasty?

This is the part of nasal surgery that The central support structure of the nose is the septum. It is made up of cartilage in the front of the nose and bone further moving and/or repositioning cartilage and back. This is what divides the nose lengthwise into two separate sides. The septum is to shape the nose in a natural way so is often "deviated" or crooked due to some it is balanced and in harmony with the type of trauma earlier in life. This can be done as a separate operation or in conjunction with a rhinoplasty.

Are Your Teeth Getting Short?

Many adults find that their front teeth are wearing down, getting thin or even chipping away. The cause of these problems is not what you eat, chewing ice or those pencils you hold in your mouth. More likely, it is unconscious, usually nocturnal movements of your lower jaw called bruxism or "night grinding". The cause may be that your back teeth do not fit together properly. It may be caused by brain waves or it may even be associated with R.E.M. sleep patterns. There may be headaches, sore muscles or jaw joint pain associated with the tooth destruction from bruxism.

If a long-term solution is desired, proper diagnosis of the type of bruxism that exists is required before your teeth are repaired. This diagnosis may require a combination of a careful history, muscle and jaw joint examination, radiographs, impressions for models, mounting these models on a simulator, a plastic oral splint 381-4040.

How to Take Your Lumps... or Maybe Not





"Our kitchen isn't that old but it's just not working for us. The island counter is too small and I absolutely hate seeing the side of our big refrigerator from the front hall." These were the thoughts Kathy Civik expressed to Barrington Kitchen & Bath Studio's designer Kaye Hathaway at their first meeting. Kathy and her husband Ken built their house overlooking Bangs Lake in Wauconda about 15 years ago. "Pickled" finishes and Southwestern colors were the rage then and that's what they put into their house. But, Kathy's taste had changed over the years, and she now wanted a more traditional feeling.

Kaye, who's both a certified kitchen designer and a certified interior designer worked with the Civik's to create the kitchen that Kathy had been dreaming of. Kaye drew them a sketch of the kitchen with the arch and the couple realized that it ate up a lot of storage space. So instead the range was enclosed by bringing cabinets, one with a pullout spice rack and another with dividers for baking pans, down to the counter top and building a beaded-board range hood between them. That really set the focal point for the kitchen! The new built-in refrigerator was moved away from the kitchen entry and replaced with glass fronted cabinets. These lighted cabinets provide display space for special china and give visitors an inviting first view of the new kitchen.


The desk area in the original kitchen was much larger than the family needed. Kaye suggested building a walk-in pantry with a curtained glass door to provide storage for bulky items. That left enough room for a smaller desk which was given a furniture look with a carved onlay and special moldings. The island, which had housed the cooktop and a raised seating area, has now become a baking and food prep center. Three specially designed carved posts support the eating bar, which was kept at counter height to provide maximum counter space.

The Civik's chose Crystal cabinets in Antique White with a brown highlight to provide the sophisticated look that Kathy craved. Dark green granite countertops provide contrast. Ken Civik, who is a tile contractor, installed a random-sized ceramic floor with a stone look and a tumbled marble back-



splash. Being in the trades, Ken knew that a professional installation would be critical to the final appearance of their kitchen. He contracted with Barrington Kitchen & Bath Studio's sister company Delta Renovations to do the installation.

Art Associates to View Exhibit on 18th Century China

Richer than all of Europe combined, 18th century China under the emperor known as Qianlong (cheeyen-loong) was the largest empire the country has ever known with resources of gold, jade, rice, silk, livestock, land and priceless art.

Qianlong, who ruled from 1736 to 1795, was a Manchu, an ethnic minority ruling over the Han Chinese majority. He incorporated Han Chinese symbols and colors into almost everything he touched, including his gold-lacquered throne featuring the five-clawed dragon, an ancient Han imperial symbol reserved exclusively for riches the emperor.

Imperial women did not have their feet bound as Han Chinese women did. They wore shoes with a platform heel, which gave them a similar gait to the Han.

Qianlong was an athlete and a fine hunter but also wrote and published 46,000 poems. He was creative, liked experimental designs and new ways of using old materials, and was interested in recording what was happening in his court and his life.

On Thursday, May 20, the Barrington Community Associates of the Art Institute of Chicago will sponsor a trip to The Field Museum to view the exhibition "Splendors of China's Forbidden City: The Glorious Reign of Emperor Qianlong."

Many of the 400 artifacts have never left the forbidden city, including royal garments, a pure gold Buddhist shrine, domestic objects and the emperor's personal

Chinese court life is depicted in different scenes. The emperor's supreme power is shown in the Imperial Throne Room. The size and strict organization of the emperor's family is demonstrated in the Family Banquet Room. His private interest in religion and public support of all faiths is revealed in the Tibetan Buddhist Shrine. Six paintings by Jesuit court artist Giuseppe Castiglione, hand-picked by Qianlong, also reveal scenes of court life.

Walkup Heritage Farm & Gardens Specializing in Native Plant Species

Walkup Heritage Farm & Gardens is years old, still stand on the property along located on the original Walkup residence at 5215 Walkup Road in Crystal Lake. It is directly across the road from Veteran Acres Park midway between Route 176 and Hillside Avenue.

The farm is currently owned by Michael J. Walkup, a member of the Walkup family which built the home in 1856. The Walkups were one of the original settlers in McHenry County and the Crystal Lake area, arriving here in 1835 as the area was being opened up for settlement.

The original Walkup land encompassed much of modern-day Crystal Lake, extending along Walkup from Crystal Lake Avenue on the south to near the presentday Prairie Ridge High School on the north and including the present site of the Crystal Lake Municipal Center. Today, only the home and five acres of land remain.

The house, in addition to being one of the oldest in the area, is also one of the most unique, being completely covered by approximately 70,000 small cobblestones, many of which were hauled to the site on ox carts from the shores of Lake Michigan. It is plaqued by the Polly Crandell Questers of Crystal Lake and by the McHenry County Historic Preservation Commission.

The home has been turned into a specialty garden center by Michael Walkup. It contains plants and vegetables reminiscent of the time the house was built and later to the end of the 19th century. Many of the original oak trees, now over 200

with mature black walnuts planted by the

Walkup Heritage Farm & Gardens specializes in the sale of native plant species, such as prairie and woodland plants, as well as heirloom ornamental flowering plants and vegetables. This year, they will offer a dozen varieties of heirloom tomatoes along with a complete line of garden vegetables, all grown from 100-or-moreyear-old seed sources and not generally available elsewhere. Also for sale are heirloom roses, peonies, annuals and perennials. All plants and vegetables are raised without the use of chemicals.

The grounds of Walkup Heritage Farm & Gardens have been decorated with examples of various native plant communities and also feature a butterfly garden with heirloom annuals and a sunken Victorian garden containing heirloom perennials. There is also an heirloom rose garden and a peony garden with Grandma Walkup's original peonies.

Take a trip back in time and visit the Walkup Heritage Farm & Gardens. The hours are weekdays from 3 to 6 p.m., Saturdays from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., and Sundays from 1 to 5 p.m., starting May 1 and extending through Oct. 31. Flats of heirloom annuals, perennials and vegetable plants along with a complete line of native plants will be available in May with a farmstand featuring heirloom vegetables starting in midsummer.



Tibetan Lamas to Create Sand Painting Mandala at Harper

Tibetan lamas from the Drepung Loseling plete. After construction, the monks con-Monastery near Lhasa, Tibet, will create a tantric Buddhist mandala sand painting, one of Tibet's most unique artistic traditions, from Monday, May 3 to Wednesday, May 5, in the Cockrell Dining Room of Building A at Harper College, Roselle and Algonquin roads, Palatine.

There will be an opening ceremony at 11:00 a.m. on Monday, May 3, when the monks consecrate the site of the mandala sand painting "to generate energies for global healing" with about 30 minutes of chants, music and mantra recitation. After the opening ceremony, the monks will begin drawing the line design for the mandala—exacting work that takes about three hours to complete.

During construction of the mandala, the monks pour millions of grains of sand from traditional metal funnels called "chakpur". The finished mandala is about 5' by 5' in size and generally requires a minimum of three days of work to com-

clude their creation with a consecration ceremony

When it is time to dismantle the mandala, the monks perform a closing ceremony by sweeping up the colored sands to symbolize "the impermanence of all that exists." The remaining sand is carried in procession by the monks, accompanied by guests, to a flowing body of water. The sand is ceremonially poured into the water, "thus dispersing the healing energies of the mandala throughout the world."

Sand mandalas were created in New York and Washington, D.C., in the wake of the Sept. 11 tragedies.

"The production by the monk artists.. expresses the purity and sophistication of the Tibetan sacred performing arts," says actor Richard Gere.
