

North American Young Riders' Championships Bring Taste of Olympics to Chicago Area





Equestrians, ages 16 to 21, from throughout North America, will compete at the 2004 North American Young Riders' Championships, a Junior Olympic-Equestrian event. This premier competition follows the three Olympic disciplines of eventing (left), dressage and show jumping (right). Sponsored by Maui Jim Sunglasses, the event will be held at Tempel Farms in Old Mill Creek, IL, on Aug. 10 to 15. For more information, call 1-847-244-9207 or visit www.youngriders.org.

This August, Chicago-area horse lovers will have a choice: sit at home and wait for the Olympic equestrian events to be broadcast on television or take a drive into the far North Suburban countryside and experience the firsthand excitement of watching tomorrow's Olympians make their own mark on the equestrian world.

The 2004 Maui Jim® North American Young Riders' Championships, a breeding ground for future equestrian Olympians, return to Tempel Farms in Old Mill Creek, IL, Aug. 13 to 15. The premiere equestrian competition in North America pits riders, aged 16 to 21, in Olympic-level games, often for the first time. Riders from the United States, Canada, Mexico, Puerto Rico and the Caribbean Islands and their steeds participate in the same Olympic disciplines of show jumping, dressage and eventing as will be seen in the Athens games

Show jumping, an audience favorite where speed and agility are key, features a course of 15 obstacles ranging up to five feet in height for the horse to jump. Rooted in classical Greek horsemanship and knights in shining armor, dressage is

equine power is guided through precise movements resembling ballet choreography by riders using barely perceptible signals. Three-day eventing, which traces its roots to the 1912 Stockholm Olympics, measures a horse and rider's endurance biathlon style through a challenging crosscountry course, in addition to show jumping and dressage.

Many equestrians have used the North American Young Riders' Championships as a springboard to international success and even the Olympics.

"With the excitement surrounding the Athens games, this is a special year for Young Riders," noted events director and Lake Forest resident Howard Simpson. "You can feel the excitement in the air as there may be future Olympians showing here this year.'

An official USA Junior Olympic Equestrian event offers riders valuable experience in competition under the Federation Equestre Internationale, the international governing body for equestrian sport. Participants will show in at least one of the three disciplines.

Founded in 1974 as an eventing challenge between the United States and Canada, the North American Young Riders' Championship grew in size and acclaim as riders from the Northern Hemisphere transported their horses to compete internationally. In 1981, dressage championships were added to the event with show jumping added the following year. The first complete championships, recognized and conducted in accordance with the Federation Equestre Internationale, were held in British Columbia, Canada, in 1982. Tempel Farms has hosted the championship 13 times since 1985.

Protecting Your Legal Rights— Illness and Injury and Employment

If an employee is injured or suffers serious illness, numerous federal and state laws may be implicated. For instance, the Illinois Workers' Compensation Act covers an employee for an injury which occurs on the job. A federal statute that may apply to protect an employee in the situation of illness or off-the-job injury is The Family and Medical Leave Act of 1993 (FMLA). Plastic Surgery and People's Fears

by Gary S. Churchill, MD

Many people think and talk about getting plastic surgery for years but fear prevents them from taking that final step and actually carrying through with it. Their concerns are understandable, and undergoing surgery is certainly not something to be taken lightly. Yet many of these fears can be eased with a little more knowledge and some accurate information.

Fear of the Results

A facelift is probably the procedure most feared by patients. One concern they have is that a facelift won't look natural; nobody wants to look pulled or too tight. The goal is to look refreshed and not as if surgery was performed. So how is this accomplished? Rather than depending on extensive skin undermining and pulling as is commonly done, we use a less invasive technique that depends more on tightening the deeper layers beneath the skin. This lifts and tightens the skin in a more natural way, distributing the tension from beneath the skin rather than directly from the incisions. The result is a faster recovery, a longer lasting result and a very natural look. This technique also minimizes the tension on the incisions resulting in far better healing.

Fear of Scars

Patients also worry that their scars will show. Unfortunately, many surgeons still use incisions that result in visible scars. But this is not the case with our incisions. After years of experience and constant refinements, we have developed an incision that is virtually undetectable when it has healed. The uniqueness of our incision is

A Gray Area

One of the greatest challenges in dentistry is finding materials that can withstand the forces generated in the mouth. In the past, gold has been the material that combined biocompatibility with strength. It is still the standard by which all new materials are measured.

But what do we do when we have to crown a front tooth? Decades ago, gold was used on the front teeth. But as you can imagine, their appearance was far from satisfactory. Technicians started to experiment with different plastics and porcelains to cover the gold and create a crown that was white in appearance. This is the system that is most frequently used today when making tooth-colored crowns. The drawback to this system has always been the opacity of the crown. Light cannot be transmitted through the restoration because of the gold substructure, and this resulted in teeth that looked like Chiclets. Another problem is the appearance of this gold at the gumline. When someone smiles and you see a gray area at the margin where the crown ends and the gums begin, you're looking at unpolished gold that appears to be gray. In some instances, this gravness will radiate into the gum tissue because the metal used under the porcelain was not gold but a cheaper substitute. The molecules of the cheaper metal are leached into the gum tissue creating

that it preserves the hairline in its natural position. While most surgeons place their incision in a straight line in front of the ear where a telltale scar will be seen, we hide the incisions in all the natural creases around and then just inside the ear. We also use dissolving sutures in all the incisions so no staples or sutures ever need to be removed.

Fear of Pain

The fear of post-operative pain prevents some people from considering undergoing surgery. However, facial surgery is not generally painful. During a facelift, the skin around the incisions is lifted. The skin will be numb at first, reducing postoperative pain. Most patients describe a facelift as feeling "tight." Very few people complain about pain.

Fear of Anesthesia

Anesthesia is far safer now than ever before. The newer anesthetic medications and monitoring equipment have revolutionized the field of outpatient surgery. There are new and effective medications



substructures in order to eliminate the gray appearance and the opacity. Unfortunately, many of them have fallen short on the durability scale and result in fractured porcelain. That is, until now. A company from Europe produces a white substructure that is just as strong as gold without the undesirable appearance. The substructure is fabricated in a central lab using digitized information e-mailed to them using the dentist's impression. The substructure then has porcelain applied to it just like the gold ones do. The result is a natural-looking crown that doesn't show any gray at the gumline.

Our office has been delivering these crowns to our patients for about five years and has seen no signs of early breakdown or fracture. If you are seeing gray and want to make a change, now is the time you can do so with long-lasting, predictable results.





That's No Name for an Indian

Inspired by the shards found in the kivas of her ancient pueblo, Lucy Lewis (1897-1992) started to create her famed pottery around the turn of the century.

From Acoma Pueblo, the oldest continuously inhabited settlement in North America, Lucy Lewis is considered the matriarch of Acoma pottery, and along with Maria Martinez, is one of the best known Pueblo potters.

Lewis became one of the most important craftspersons of this century, continuing a tradition dating back hundreds of years. Her coil-built, low-fired pieces are painted with colored slips and reflect the images of the Anasazi and Mimbres pottery that she studied at the Museum of New Mexico.

A poem about this gentle lady of pottery says:

You laugh and say, 'Lucy Lewis! That's no name for an Indian!"

The name is the voice embedded in vessels of pigmented polychrome of stylized animals with heart-like line

sharp-edged lightning strikes on pearly white glaze decorating seed pots, jars and wedding vases, holding ancient stories.

Give Your Child's Teeth a Sporting Chance

Injuries to a child's mouth, face and head the possibility of a concussion. during sports have become more common. The injury rates in football, ice hockey and lacrosse have decreased significantly due to the requirement that all participants wear a helmet with face guard and a mouth guard. Baseball and softball now lead all youth sports in the number of oral-facial injuries sustained by its players. The sports with the next highest number of oral-facial injuries are soccer, basketball, volleyball and wrestling. All of these are sports where mouth protection isn't required.

Athletic mouth guards are made of soft plastic adapted to fit comfortably to the shape of the upper teeth. Athletic protectors shield the child's gums, lips and cheeks from being cut, reduce the chance of tooth injury by about 90% and reduce 1-847-991-4663.

The only protector that an athlete will wear is one that is comfortable and does not interfere with speech. The stock or mouth-formed (boil and bite) protectors found in sporting goods stores can be helpful. However, the most comfortable, tightest fitting and protective of the guards are the multilayer, custom-made protectors available through the dentist. The custom guards cost a bit more but can be worn for all of the sports that the child participates in. They can last for a couple of years before being replaced.





REMODELING 2004

Experts predict that more people will be able to work from home as technology progresses. That was one impetus behind a recent remodeling project undertaken by Tom and Susan Carroll of Inverness. A mistake in the framing for a project like this will definitely show in the finished room." The addition also boasts a trayed ceiling with uplighting behind beautiful moldings and a custom-built fireplace by Rich Dworshak, one of Delta's master carpenters.

The Carrolls worked with Ross Gerami, a designer with Delta Renovation's sister company, Barrington Kitchen & Bath Studio, to design cabinetry worthy of this beautiful new space. The Carrolls chose Crystal cabinetry in a richly-stained cherrywood. Ross designed special angled cabinets to flank

the bookcases. Fluted pilasters and an oversized crown molding were incorporated to add visual weight to the bookcases, keeping them in scale with the new room. The custom desk and credenza needed a practical work surface that wouldn't look too "kitcheny or bathroomy". Ross was able to find a laminated product that exactly matched the cherry stain. When combined with cherry-edge molding, it makes a surface that will stand up to daily work, yet be beautiful enough to complement the rest of the room. A wet-bar with beveled glass mullion doors was included to make the room amenable to entertaining.
