
# Friends of Home of the Sparrow Present "The Enchanting Vineyard"



# Protecting Your Legal Rights— **Employment Contracts and Promises**

A legally enforceable contract is one in which the parties to an agreement provide something of value to the other. To create an employment contract, the employer must make a specific offer and there must be an acceptance of those terms by the employee. A written contract is the most easily recognized employment agreement and usually contains specific terms and conditions regarding the employment relationship such as salary, responsibilities and duration. Other written documents may also be considered a contract, such as employer handbooks, policy manuals, letters of agreement or letters reflecting a job offer. To determine whether such writings are deemed enforceable contracts, the facts and circumstances of a particular case must be examined. However, an employer may effectively prevent enforcement of such a writing as a contract if the document contains a disclaimer specifically stating that the document does not change the employment at will relation-

As such, to limit an employer's right to terminate the employee at will, the document must contain language which shows the employer and employee did not intend an employment at will relationship, such as a termination for cause only provision. A determination of whether there is an enforceable contract or promise requires a legal analysis of the documents and facts and circumstances surrounding the employment relationship. If you believe you have an enforceable contract or a promise which has not been honored, I encourage you not to delay receiving information regarding your legal rights. # **Facelift Surgery**

Most people who are familiar with modern facelifts and other facial cosmetic procedures are aware of their important benefits, in terms of improved appearance as well as self-esteem. However, many people who are good candidates for these procedures may be reluctant to actually have them out of fear of the process itself.

They fear that they might experience pain during the surgery, or that recovery might bring pain or discomfort, or that it might take too long to heal, or that they might find some other aspect of the surgery unacceptable. The truth is that virtually every one of our patients reports that their recovery was faster and more comfortable than they expected.

In this context, I would like to share with you the comments of one of our recent facelift patients, a 53-year-old female. She was asked to respond to some very direct questions we posed about her experience with the facelift surgery. While some patients may report more difficult recoveries, this patient's experience is fairly typical.


• Was the procedure itself painful? No, I didn't feel anything. I really don't recall a thing about it.

Fact: The American Board of Plastic Surgery, Inc. (ABPS) does not contain the words "facial" or "cosmetic". Any "board" containing these words has no relationship to The American Board of Plastic Surgery, Inc. (ABPS). These other "boards", despite their inclusion of the words "plastic surgery", are organized by individuals and have "certified" members who most probably have not received extensive, formal training in plastic surgery from an ABPS certified plastic surgeon.

Fact: The American Society of Plastic Surgeons (ASPS) will only allow plastic surgeons who are certified by The American Board of Plastic Surgery, Inc. (ABPS) into its membership.

Fact: The American Society For Aesthetic Plastic Surgery (ASAPS) will only allow plastic surgeons who are certified by The American Board of Plastic Surgery, Inc. (ABPS) into its membership.

Fact: Any U.S. medical school graduate, regardless of an absence of proper training in plastic surgery or certification by The American Board of Plastic Surgery, Inc. (ABPS), is allowed to call themselves a plastic surgeon and to perform plastic surgery on you and your face. This is very scary and you can unknowingly put yourself at risk.

By asking the following questions and by asking them in the following precise manner, you can determine with certainty the two most important facts you need to verify about anyone claiming to be a plastic surgeon: does the individual before you possess hospital privileges to perform face and neck lift surgeries on you and is the person before you certified by The American Board of Plastic Surgery, Inc.

1. Are you allowed to perform any face lift and neck lift surgery at a hospital? The response must be yes and should never be no. A lengthy response is also a big red flag. You can magnify them, rotate them or make them color. No chemicals are used for developing, which saves the environment. The patient and dentist can view the X-ray together, because it's up on a large computer screen.




This technology has been out for years, but the initial images were not as detailed as the regular X-ray film. Recent improvements in imaging software has made it possible for these digital systems to give greater detail than the old films. Even the American Dental Association has given their approval, which was denied in past years because of the image quality.

Digital X-rays will slowly make their way into all dental offices. Until then, you will only find it in a small percentage of practices that have the computer support



## Our Local Trees Suffer Damage

have placed many of our local trees in sement. The good news is that fall is the rious stress. Symptoms of this stress have been showing up as early as summer with early fall color, yellow or browning leaves, and premature leaf drop. Plants that were already weak at the start of this year are at the most risk of damage or possible death. It may take years before the full extent of these abnormal weather conditions are evident

#### Here's What Happened

Early spring left us with 68% less rainfall than the 70-year average. This is a critical time for plants as they require large quantities of moisture to produce new roots and leaves. These dry conditions hindered normal root and leaf development. Late spring-early summer produced record rainfalls. These wet conditions gave rise to a record outbreak of foliar diseases. The heavy rains also saturated our soils, cutting off vital oxygen to the roots and forcing them to grow up towards the surface. Shallow rooted plants are unable to get at moisture deep in the soil and are dependent on frequent rains. Mid-late summer brought on drought conditions at a time when these shallow rooted plants needed frequent moisture. This lack of rain caused even more damage to the fine roots that were up on the surface.

The abnormal weather of 2004 damaged the roots and leaves of many plants, reducing their ability to produce the food fall offer, contact them at 847-304-4144.



## "Life as a Working Sculptor" **Topic for Art Program**



## Form, Function—Fabulous!

The Crystal cabinetry, finished in a light warm stain with a highlight, gives an inviting, Old-World charm to the Wood's new

kitchen. Bordeaux Granite countertops add a splash of drama. As a special touch, a built-in toaster was added to the cabinetry in the breakfast area, allowing the Woods to enjoy breakfast while gazing out upon the pond and its majestic swans.


