Facial Plastic Surgery, Looking Your Best

Dr. Churchill specializes in plastic and reconstructive surgery of the face and neck. He has an office and private surgical suite in Barrington, and is one of a handful of physicians in the country to complete extensive subspecialty training through a fellowship with the prestigious American Academy of Facial Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery. Dr. Churchill is board certified and on staff at a number of local hospitals and surgery centers. The following is an excerpt from an upcoming newsletter.

What's New in Facial Surgery

Although facelifts have been performed for years, the techniques have progressively improved over time to give more natural and longer lasting results. The way facelifts are performed today is a synthesis of a better understanding of the anatomy and dynamics of facial surgery.

What is the SMAS?

The most important step in the development of better facelifts came from the identification of the structure called the SMAS. Before that it was assumed that tightening the skin alone was all that was necessary to accomplish a facelift. Early facelifts were accomplished by simply excising the excess skin, pulling the remaining skin tighter, and closing the incision. But these lifts did not last long and soon the patient looked the same as they did prior to surgery.

In reality facial skin laxity is based on laxity of the SMAS. SMAS stands for the Superficial Musculo Aponeurotic System, or in other words the structure just beneath the skin that is made up of the platysma muscle and tough connective tissues. the overlying skin also tightens.

As we've seen, early facelifts did nothing to tighten the SMAS. Modern facelifts, however, should always tighten the SMAS. The result is a more natural appearing lift that lasts for years.

How is the SMAS Tightened?

An incision is made around the ears and the skin released for a short distance off the SMAS. At this point the SMAS may be tucked up toward the ear (this is called a plication) or the SMAS may also be released and sutured to a higher attachment point (this is called a SMAS flap technique). The latter technique is also called a deep plain facelift or composite facelift by some surgeons. In either technique the jowls and neck are tightened significantly, but the deep plain technique has the potential to improve the creases going from the nose to the lip better. Most surgeons still don't do a deep plain facelift as it is technically more demanding. I choose the technique that best suits the patient.

Keeping an eye on Congress. There have been proposals made in Congress to change the amount of unified credit. On October 26, 1995, the House of Representatives passed H.R.2491, followed by the Senate on October 27. Both versions of the budget reconciliation bill, include an increase in the unified credit.

The Senate bill would provide an increase in the exemption equivalent amount from \$600,000 to \$750,000 in 2001. The increase would be phased in so that the exemption equivalent amount would be \$625,000 in 1996 and would increase by \$25,000 in each succeeding year until it reached in \$750,000 in 2001.

The House would increase the unified credit more rapidly so that the exemption equivalent amount would be \$700,000 in 1996 and would reach \$750,000 in 1998.



Poor Report Cards: What To Do

lies. If you and your child are unhappy about a report card, what should you do? When you look at your child's report card and performance record, the most important things to evaluate are these: Is your child doing his or her best? Is he or she achieving his or her highest potential?

According to Dr. Raymond Huntington, founder and president of Huntington Learning Centers, "Parents know their own children. If you believe your child could be doing better than his or her grades show, you owe it to your child to remedy the situation."

"More than current grades are at stake, " Huntington continues, "If grades are mediocre or poor, it means your child is not gaining valuable skills. This can come back to haunt the child later. The skills children learn in school are like building blocks. If a skill is not learned adequately, future skills will suffer. When a child tries to build advanced skills on a shaky foundation of knowledge, there's likely to be trouble ahead."

Mediocre or poor grades can result from a variety of problems. Dr. Huntington offers the following suggestions for what to do when a child brings home a poor report card:

1. Examine the situation realistically. Report card day brings stress to many fami- portant to identify and remedy the basic problem, so it does not continue to hurt your child's education.

2. What is really the problem? Is there a behavior problem? Sometimes, bright students get bad grades for behavior related activities. Does your child hand in their homework? Is it correct and on time? Is your child bored with schoolwork, and so is not paying enough attention? These are not excuses; they are symptoms of different problems. You must identify the problem before you can remedy it.

3. Talk with your child. Why does he think he got poor grades? Does he take the situation seriously? How does he plan to do better? It's important that your child knows you take the situation seriously. Work with him to develop a plan that will help him to achieve better grades. Let him know you are supportive and that you believe in his abilities.

4. Talk with your child's teacher or counselor. Your child's teacher or counselor is a professional educator. What are her observations? What does she recommend?

It is important to remember that the difficulty that caused these poor grades may be a serious problem. Your child may have missed one or more important skills. It's vital that you get help for your child as soon as possible, before the problem gets worse.
