

Spilling wine at a crowded dinner party... lifelike figures from recycled paper. In some cases, Steinmeyer reduces watercolor or print-making paper back into pulp. Then, rather than painting the pulp, she dyes it using a wide range of colors and hues. Next, the pulp is molded into large shapes and forms. Many transform into human figures-brimming with character and personality-that when shown, hang frameless on the wall.

> In addition to the media she chooses to work with, Steinmeyer's work is unusual because of the situations in which her sculptures are depicted. All are in the middle of some kind of every day activity, whether it



#### Hopi Tribute & Jewelry Demonstration

For those wishing to learn more about Hopi culture as revealed through the skilled hands of an artist, a demonstration and show is planned for master Hopi silversmith, Ramon Dalangyawma. Ramon will demonstrate his etching, cutting and shaping techniques, at Tribal Expressions in Arlington Heights.

Ramon has perfected what is referred to as the Hopi overlay technique. Two pieces of silver are used, one in which the design element is cut out and the second to which the first is soldered. The depressions create designs which are oxidized in contrast against the highly polished raised surface.

"Flawless" is the term that best describes Ramon's cutting ability. Patterns used by Ramon include stylized animal, nature, and pottery themes, and they are often embellished with concave, convex and other curved surfaces. His designs invite close scrutiny and inspection and stand up to the keenest evaluation.

Ramon lives with his wife and seven year old son near Hotevilla, Arizona. He is ac-

## Infection Control And Your Dental Visit

Some people are so concerned about contracting the A.I.D.'s virus or other diseases that they are avoiding dental visits and neglecting their oral health. Dentists are frequently silent about the infection control methods in their office because they think bringing up the subject will increase patient's fears. The Center for Disease Control has set up what are termed Universal Precautions to be used by all staff involved in patient care. These precautions include the use of gloves, masks, needles, saliva ejectors, and other items which are disposed of after use on each patient.

Instruments which are not disposable are sterilized with high heat or gas sterilization. In our office, dental instruments are kept in cassettes. These cassettes are first immersed in a large ultrasonic cleaner to remove debris and then are rinsed and transferred to the autoclave for high heat sterilization.

#### Enjoy "Woodlands And Wildflowers" Highlighting Barrington Homes

area homes will be highlighted during Citizens For Conservation's first native garden tour, "Woodlands and Wildflowers," on Saturday, May 11, from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

The walk is designed to educate amateur and experienced gardeners on the process of restoring native woodland and prairie landscapes, demonstrate the beauty of natural gardens and raise funds for Citizens For Conservation (CFC) projects. A sale of native plants will allow participants who are interested to start their own gardens.


The walk will feature native gardens at the homes of Henry and Wendy Paulson, Scott and Jo Seagren and Waid and Ruth Vanderpoel. The Paulson's Barrington Hills home is situated at the edge of Cook County's Spring Creek Valley Forest Preserve on a glacial moraine. Adjacent to the property, a gravel hill prairie of several acres escaped grazing and the plow and has become the catalyst for restoration of native prairie and savanna on the five-acre private site. Remnants of native plant populations hung on beneath a jungle of buckthorn and honeysuckle when the Paulsons began actively restoring the site about ten years ago. Clearing of invasive species and the reintroduction of fire has reinvigorated existing populations of shooting star, prairie trillium, Jacob's ladder and three species of Solomonseal.

The indigenous gardens of three Barrington been reintroduced. Little bluestem, side oats grama, bottlebrush grass and wild rye grow vigorously while prairie lousewort, blueeyed grass, bloodroot, starry false Solomonseal and other forbs add color and bloom in early spring. Nearer the house, a more manipulated wildflower garden includes twinleaf, bellflower, blue cohosh, white baneberry, wild ginger, wild phlox and other woodland species.

Six years ago, the Seagren house in Barrington Hills was nearly invisible from the street, hidden by buckthorn and box elder trees. Extensive clearing over several years revealed majestic oak and linden trees, a perfect savanna setting. The new-found light and the introduction of fire brought back three species of Solomonseal, prairie trillium, penn sedge, white baneberry, shooting stars and wild geranium on parts of this one-acre site. A plethora of native grasses, wildflowers and ferns were brought in by seed and by plug. Native trees and shrubs were also planted. Since the clearing and planting process is being done in stages, this property is a good example of restoration work in process.

The Vanderpoel's Lake Barrington property includes four unique gardens: a spring wildflower savanna, a large prairie, an alpine rock garden and a high plains garden. Begun in 1966, the savanna originally contained separate and distinct wildflower Seeds from the adjacent Spring Creek beds; however, as the wildflowers spread
