#### Mandatory Distributions From Qualified Retirement Plans

November is here and the holiday season is rapidly approaching. It is time to think of Christmas shopping. I would like this year to be different and have my shopping complete before December, but I know that is an impossibility. I hope we all take the time to enjoy the holiday season with family and friends, to relax, and remember and be thankful for the truly important things

Last month I discussed retirement plans. This month I would like to continue the discussion and focus on mandatory distributions from qualified retirement plans and penalties for having too much in your plan when you pass on.

The Internal Revenue Service has defined qualified retirement plans to include employer qualified pension, profitsharing or stock bonus plans, annuity plans, annuity contracts, custodial accounts, and individual retirement plans (IRA). The Tax Reform Act of 1986 enacted mandatory distribution rules concerning when distributions from qualified plans must begin and at what rate they must be paid out. The general rule is that the required date to begin distribution from qualified plans is April 1 following the year in which the employee attains the age of 70½. A minimum rate of distribution is required to assure that the deferred compensation is not being used for asset accumulation purposes.

by taking into account the life span of the employee and a designated beneficiary. If less than the minimum required amount is distributed, then a tax is imposed equal to 50% of the shortfall.

In addition, a 15% excise tax is placed on excess distributions from retirement plans and a 15% additional estate tax is placed on excess retirement accumulations in qualified retirement plans. In accumulations. 1996, an individual can take up to



\$155,000 from his/her qualified retirement plans before the excess distribution tax would be imposed. This amount is adjusted each year to reflect increases in the Consumer Price index.

If at the time of an individuals death the value of his/her undistributed benefits in one or more qualified retirement plans exceeds a certain amount, a 15% excise tax will be applied with respect to the excess amount. The 15% tax is applied to the extent that the value of the individuals undistributed benefits exceeds The minimum distribution is calculated the present value of a hypothetical single life annuity amount, with annual payments equal to \$155,000 that would have been payable commencing in the year of the individuals death if the individual had

As you can see, the distribution of retirement benefits should be carefully planned because of the complex nature of the excise tax on excess distributions and excess







#### Interesting Atmosphere Wonderful Food



You can almost smell the salt air as you set foot into Port Edward Restaurant. In our indoor harbor floats the 25 foot "Porpoise" sailboat built in 1934 by Bond Boat Builders in Chicago. The Porpoise was Tony Bond's personal boat and was designed by his close friend and associate, naval architect John Deering. The strong and large wooden hull would have made her a fine fishing vessel at the turn of the century. But now our unique Porpoise is to dine one or two couples graciously in her cabin... a true unique dining adventure!

Our indoor harbor is New England inspired. To the south by the Colony House of Newport, Rhode Island North, by the old

Union Oyster House in Boston, and the picturesque Fisherman's Lobster Dock Shacks of old Penobscot Bay, Maine.

The huge timbers, joists and decking were salvaged from an old Milwaukee cheese factory and the old Starck Piano Company warehouse of Chicago. The strong timbers are virgin cutting of long leaf yellow pine, no longer available commercially. Three McHenry County barns were used for planking and hand hewn timbers for the Salem Lounge and Wine cellar. The old 1920's windmill dividing the lobby and the lounge was saved from destruction by Edward and provided an intimate setting for "popping the question" or romantic dining.

Fox River was inspired by the House of Seven Gables of Salem, Massachusetts. Salem's obsession with witchcraft in 1692 motivated the building of a secret room and stairs for the safety of the owner's sisters to provide a hideout from the "burning at the stake" witch hunters. We too have a secret room in the lounge. Look and see if you can find it. In the far end of the restaurant is the Navigator's Room with an outstanding collection of hard hat diving helmets, whaling harpoons, lances and an old jaw bone of a Sperm Whale. Hanging from the ceiling are oars from World War II Liberty Ship life boats.

We are celebrating Port Edward's 32nd anniversary this year with Edward's continuous hand on the helm. Interestingly, in 30 years of serving Alaskan King Crab Legs, Port Edward's suppliers have calculated that put end to end, the crab legs will have gone around the world during our celebration.

The encrusted cannons by the entry are of Spanish origin, circa 1680, from the Caribbean and the double ship's wheel is from an Alaskan ice breaker. The coral encrusted anchor in front of our indoor harbor was hauled up from the east coast of the Florida Keys and a few steps away, an old diver's two

Our lounge overlooking the beautiful man pump from Montreal, Canada in excellent working order. Just up to the side of it is a battered French ship's figure head from the turn of the 17th century. Throughout the restaurant is a collection of English antique nautical signs, rare "lead top" and 18th century binnacles, Edward Wolowiec's original paintings and nautical artifacts too numerous to mention. The collections and selection of Edward's world wide travels are reflected in our "gifts international" shop next to the wine cellar in our lower level. Top Side features an art gallery with more of Edward Wolowiec's paintings as well as nautical prints of other outstanding artists such as Turner, Spurling, Carl Evers and Charles Vickery.

Long Grove went into a sleepy decline in the 20's and 30's. The quaint, old buildings remained untouched by progress. In the 40's several women opened an antique resale shop. It proved a boon that highways 83 and 53 had bypassed the crossroads, preserving the historic integrity of the village. PLEASE NOTE: Special dated and timed 1917) is well-known as one of the leading artists in the Impressionist movement of the 1870s and early 1880s. His sumptuous pictures of the ballet; his innovative studies of the racetrack; his revolutionary studies of laundresses and prostitutes; and his brightly colored pastels of the female nude-all have been celebrated for their sharp observation and their engagement with contemporary urban life. By contrast, the works of Degas's mature years, to which Renoir's statement refers, have attracted relatively little attention. Degas, who lived to be 83, was 51 in 1886, when he participated in the last Impressionist exhibition. Thereafter, he showed his art only sporadically, hoarding large numbers of pictures in his studio. His reputation as an eccentric expanded, and rumors about him developed—that he had become a bitter, reclusive misanthrope; that he never left his studio; even that his weak eyesight had deteriorated into total blindness, so that he stopped painting and drawing altogether. It is unsurprising, therefore, that his later works have come to be either misrepresented or unknown to a wide pub-

Yet Degas's active career stretched well into the first decade of this century, spanning more than 50 years in total. For much in the Prints and Drawings Galleries now of this late period, he remained in contact



#### How Do I Work With A Kitchen Designer?

You've decided that the time has finally come to remodel your kitchen. You're facing a multitude of decisions to make your dream kitchen become a reality. What wood, style and finish to I want for my new cabinetry? Should I choose a freestanding range or a built-in model? Would I like solid surface or laminate for the countertop?

You know you should contact a kitchen designer but you're not sure how to work with one. Many potential remodelers have questions about the role of a designer, according to Star Norini-Johnson, CKD, ASID, owner of Distinctive Kitchen Designs, Inc. in Wauconda IL. Her answers to some of the most common questions might help you in achieving your dream kitchen.

1) Will a designer try to sell me what I don't really need? "Most good designers won't oversell. They'll try to make you aware of the options available to you," Norini-Johnson says. 4) If I use a designer, how can I be sure what my kitchen will look like? "Only a few clients can visualize what their kitchen will look like from a floor plan. As a rule, I will often draw a perspective rendering of the finished kitchen. If you are not certain, or do not understand any element of the design, be sure to ask the designer to clarify the design concepts before placing the order for cabinets or other materials.

5) Will my kitchen cost more if I use a designer? "Quite often, the very opposite is true," says Norini-Johnson. "As mentioned before, designers can usually maximize the client's budget and avoid costly
