





#### Barrington Children's Choir Christmas Concert

Established in 1986, the Barrington twice weekly and performs locally for nu-Children's Choir is comprised of over 100 talented children ranging in age from 9 to 17 who perform a wide and varied repertoire. Choir members memorize and perform in various languages ranging from traditional Latin to obscure African dialects. Their repertoire spans renaissance classics to contemporary "fun" for both the choir and it's audience. Recently expanded to four separate choirs, BCC provides Barrington area children of various age groups an appropriate avenue to present their choral skills.

The Barrington Children's Choir was founded by Peggy Crawford in an effort to enrich children's lives through higher levels of musical performance. Many feel her passion and enthusiasm for the choir is the major reason for it's success. Ms. Crawford earned a master's degree from Vandercook College in Music Education and Choral Conducting and is active in the American Choral Directors Association. Assisting her are Kitty Miller, accompanist, a graduate of Lawrence University and Becky Clark, assistant director, also with a master's degree from Vandercook in Music Education.

The choir has performed in concert for a number of prestigious organizations including a 1988 Vice Presidential visit, a CBS television documentary, and several international invitational competitions. Now in it's tenth year, the choir has been invited to sing this spring in Carnegie Hall for the 1996 National Youth Choral Festival. BCC was selected as one of twelve participating choirs from over 1,100 applicants.

Children seeking to become a member of the choir must audition and be willing to commit a significant amount of their free time for rehearsals and performances. Each choir member rehearses at least once or

merous civic, church and corporate functions. Upon their return from the Carnegie Hall performance in New York, the children will appear locally in the Great Lakes Choral Festival at Orchestra Hall on May 12.

The BCC is divided into the following four individual choirs:

The Intermediate Ensemble—training our youngest members

The Chamber Choir-the seasoned core group

The "Bel Canto" Choir-High school girls' chorus

The Madrigal Choir-mature high

Some choir members have as much as ten years experience and have performed with many adult and professional choirs. Woodstock Opera House, Ravinia, Northwestern University and five months with "Joseph and The Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat" are examples of recent engagements.

The ever popular Barrington Children's Choir sang at Carnegie Hall in April, Orchestra Hall in May, Ravinia (with the CSO) in July, and at the Chicago Democratic National Convention in August. December 20 and 22 are reserved for their home town friends as the Choir invites you to join them for their annual Christmas Concert at the Barrington High School Auditorium. Artistic Director Peggy Crawford has announced two seasonal music concerts this year: December 20 at 7:30 pm and December 22 at 3:00 pm. In addition to their live performances, the choir has produced a 10th Anniversary Commemorative CD, "A Gift For Every Child," which will be available in time for the holidays. 

"Disability is a normal part of the human circumstance... and so is parenting and the family experience. We deserve a high quality of life in this arena as in all others. On a personal note, Megan's organization validated my own experience in bearing and handling my infants after spinal cord injury... and that was empowering. For example, I learned not to fear lifting my children by their clothing... I learned that my children would adapt to my abilities. My verbal signals to them helped them develop vocabulary earlier... in fact their quality of life benefits from my way of parenting," said Bristo.





You can almost smell the salt air as you set foot into Port Edward Restaurant. In our indoor harbor floats the 25 foot "Porpoise" sailboat built in 1934 by Bond Boat Builders in Chicago. The Porpoise was Tony Bond's personal boat and was designed by his close friend and associate, naval architect John Deering. The strong and large wooden hull would have made her a fine fishing vessel at the turn of the century. But now our unique Porpoise is to dine one or two couples graciously in her cabin... a true unique dining adventure!

Our indoor harbor is New England inspired. To the south by the Colony House of Newport, Rhode Island North, by the old

Union Oyster House in Boston, and the picturesque Fisherman's Lobster Dock Shacks of old Penobscot Bay, Maine.

The huge timbers, joists and decking were salvaged from an old Milwaukee cheese factory and the old Starck Piano Company warehouse of Chicago. The strong timbers are virgin cutting of long leaf yellow pine, no longer available commercially. 



 Have you considered making gifts to charitable organizations? There is no gift tax on gifts to charitable organizations. For example, you can give stock that has appreciated in value over the years to a charity, and that way your estate won't have to pay the taxes on the increased value of the stock. In addition, Charitable Remainder Trusts allow you to live off the income from the asset that you have gifted to the trust for the rest of your life, and then the trust principal goes to the charity you choose on your death, or the death of your spouse if it is set up in both your names and he or she dies last. You avoid estate taxes and capital gains taxes while at the same time helping a charitable cause.

#### How To Survive A Kitchen Remodeling Project
