

# Old-Fashioned Banking Returns To Barrington

The winter, old-fashioned banking returns to the area with the opening of Barrington Bank & Trust Company. 





ery building and prop from the school, assemble, then disassemble for storage. It is an inefficient use of manpower, with high maintenance costs. District 220's space crunch, storage and teaching space continuing to erode. The quality and realism of temporary structures are severely limited." Barrington Junior Women's Club members investigated various site possibilities. The opportunity to locate on JFK Health World land, at no cost, was a natural solution.

The task force, which also includes Penny Bartlett, Cathy Beazley, Beth Redpath, Kathy Schonekas and Jan Sheppard, researched trends in neighboring communities for nearly a year. "Although \$100,000 is a large sum of money, it must be put in perspective," commented Karen Darch, co-chair. Before beginning the project, the group visited Arlington Heights, Romeoville, St. Charles and Naperville. These towns have already built permanent sites for the Safety Town Program. Kathy Schonekas, site planner, and Harry Burroughs, architect, viewed Naperville's just completed a \$1.2 million project. "It is a wonderful asset to their community. The size is much larger than our community requires, plus they needed to build classroom space and lay concrete—two items we are fortunate to have at our disposal at JFK Health World." Local businesses, corporations, civic organizations and individuals all lent their support to the Naperville project, which will begin operation this summer.

Schaumburg is developing a similar facility, Safety Park, also through community

The Village of Barrington has approved architectural plans for the facility, and Gregg Loesch of Countryside Homes Corp.

miniature building in front of the Village Hall exists thanks to contributions from Countryside Homes, Town and Country painting, and Prate Roofing.

When the project is funded it will include streets, houses, a fire station, Village Hall, railroad crossing and traffic signs-all in child-sized scale-for hands-on learning. Specially constructed bikes are used by the children to demonstrate realistic traffic and pedestrian situations. The other safety issues that are covered are fire prevention and response; electrical, poison and drug danger; water, pool and playground safety; stranger danger, good-touch, bad touch, the importance of 911 and more.

Safety Town has received support from Barrington Police and Fire Departments with field trips, curriculum input, and participation by "Fireman Jim and "Officer Friendly.'

Professional, independent contractors teach the program and are assisted by enthusiastic Middle School Student Volun-

The Safety Town task force hopes to have necessary funds in place by Spring, so construction can begin in time for summer sessions. "A permanent recognition sign at the entrance to the facility will acknowledge donor levels and buildings and street signs will have plaques identifying generous contributions." Karen Darch added, "Nearly every member of the community has benefited in some way from the safety education community children have received for over twenty years. This is a onetime effort to build a permanent local facility that will benefit generations of children." With sufficient financial support, construction of a permanent Safety Town site in Barrington will become a reality. For further information, contact Karen Darch, is the General Contractor. # Indian Artifact Identification Seminar Set

If you have ever found or have been given a stone projectile point, this is your opportunity to have it examined and evaluated by a trained educator and archeologist. Myles Goddard, affiliated with the Ojibwa Tribe, has spent a lifetime collecting stone tools, pottery and artifacts on his family farm near Peoria. His extensive personal collection includes hundreds of paleoindian artifacts together with a 14,000 year-old bone from the Sheppard Site, the only known mammoth site in Illinois.



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# Enacted New Laws May Effect You


Happy New Year! I hope the holidays were restful and peaceful for you. In 1996, new laws were enacted that may effect you. Some of those changes are summarized in this article.

The Department of Labor (DOL) has announced reform of a pension rule that will enhance workers' retirement security by requiring employers to deposit employees' pension contributions into their plans within 15 business days following the month in which employers either withhold the money from employees' paychecks or receive checks from the employee. Previously, the regulation gave employers a maximum of 90 days in which to transfer these contributions. The effective date of this new regulation will be February 3, 1997. The DOL estimates that the revised rule will now afford participants of a \$76 million return in 1997 by having these funds deposited by the earlier date.

The 15% excise tax on excess lifetime withdrawals of lump sum distributions from qualified retirement plans has been repealed for 1997 through 1999 by the Small Business Job Protection Act. Prior to 1997, the tax was imposed on withdrawals greater than \$155,000, or lump sum distributions exceeding \$775,000. If you take advantage of the moratorium, you will still owe income tax, and possibly the 10% penalty on withdrawals prior to age 591/2 on distributions.

The Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act was passed in 1996 and included the following: In 1997, self-employed individuals will be able to increase their deduction for health insurance premiums from 30% to 40%. The deduction will increase to 45% in 1998, 2002 and 50% in 2003, 60% in 2004, 70% in 2005 and 80% thereafter. Long term care insurance premiums paid by self-employed individuals after 1996 will also be included in this allowable deduction.

Further, benefits from employers providing long term care indemnity insurance will



be tax free and per diem benefits will be tax free up to \$175 per day.

In addition, the Act instituted measures to help terminally ill individuals by allowing life insurance death benefits paid out prior to death to be income tax free. Also, the assignment of life insurance proceeds to viatical settlement companies will be exempt from income tax. Further, this income tax exclusion is limited to \$175 per day to individuals that are chronically ill.

An individual may not be excluded from coverage under a group medical health plan for a preexisting condition unless the individual received or was recommended to receive care or treatment within the six month period prior to enrollment. This exclusion may not last for more than 12 months. An excise tax will be imposed on employers who fail to comply.

Next month I will continue this discussion on changing laws and summarize the small Business Act of 1996 which makes S-Corporations a more effective vehicle to use when choosing a corporate structure. Again, Happy New Year! Have a safe and prosperous January and see you next month.



# Facial Plastic Surgery, Looking Your Best

Dr. Churchill specializes in plastic and reconstructive surgery of the face and neck. He has an office and private surgical suite in Barrington, and is one of a handful of physicians in the country to complete extensive subspecialty training through a fellowship with the prestigious American Academy of Facial Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery. Dr. Churchill is board certified and on staff at a number of local hospitals and surgery centers. The following is an excerpt from an upcoming newsletter.

Minimal Incision Surgery of the Face Definition of Terms:

Fiberoptic endoscope—a long surgical telescope 2-4mm in diameter that can be placed through a small incision to see beneath the skin or into body cavities.

Videoendoscope—the use of a camera on the endoscope to project the scope's view onto a video monitor.

What is Minimal Incision Surgery?

Perhaps the most exciting advance in surgery to come along in years is minimal incision surgery. This has revolutionized many areas of surgery. Now for the first time, minimal incision surgery can be done for certain plastic surgery procedures. Minimal incision surgery involves using fiberoptic scopes through tiny incisions to see and perform the operation. Almost everyone has heard of arthroscopic surgery of the knee and laproscopic surgery of the abdomen. These are examples of minimal incision surgeries that use fiberoptic technology to avoid larger incisions. We are now performing forehead lifting, brow lifts and removal of frown lines easily and with minimal incisions using videoendoscopic technology in our Barrington office. As new techniques are developed certain aspects of facelifting will be enhanced as may other surgeries of the face and neck.



How Can Minimal Incisions Change the Brows and Forehead?

The skin and muscles of the brow and forehead move as one unit sliding loosely up and down. The muscles are attached high up on top of the scalp and low down at the level of the orbital rims. Through a tiny incision behind the hairline a 4mm scope is placed easily beneath the muscles and special instruments are used to detach the muscles from their attachments above and below. The muscles are shifted higher and reattached resulting in an elevation of the brows. Frown lines can also be lessened at the same time.

The corrugator and procerus muscles are located between the eyebrows and pull the brows strongly down and toward the midline. This results in creases and furrows of the overlying skin. During traditional forehead lifting corrugator and procerus resection is commonly performed to weaken these muscles and lessen their effect on the overlying skin. Over time, most of the lines smooth out. Traditional surgery, though, requires an incision across the scalp extending from ear to ear. Very few people are interested in such drastic surgery for frown lines. Minimal incision surgery for frown lines is much simpler. Only two tiny

# Smiles For Success—Orthodontics

But properly aligned teeth make oral hygiene with toothbrush and floss easier and more effective.

Your number one resolution for the new products, fresh vegetables? year should be to take care of yourself. Behow can you take care of those you are responsible for. There are many areas to consider: physically, emotionally and spiritu-

Physically: check in with your doctor first. Let's think about diet. Are you tired all the time? Start by keeping a food diary. At the end of the week evaluate your choices. If you're tired all the time maybe you're not getting enough protein. Protein feeds your brain cells with chemicals responsible for sharp thinking and mental quickness. Perhaps you're using sugar for quick energy instead of protein for the long haul. People are so busy counting calories that they are not getting enough protein.

As you check your food diary how much junk food are you eating? What is your fiber intake? Are you using whole grain

Emotionally: where do good feelings cause if you don't take care of yourself, come from? Good mood brain chemicals are manufactured from certain food you eat. Negative mood are a result of deficiencies in brain chemicals, whether from skipping meals or eating bad mood foods. Serotonin is responsible for regulating sleep, mood and appetite. Carbohydrate rich foods are partially responsible for the serotonin levels. Protein foods are responsible for sharp thinking and mental quickness. Without them, mental fogginess and confusion can result. Endorphins are the body's natural pain killers whether emotional or physical. Eating properly, as well as exercise produces endorphins. When your brain is deficient it can cause depression. 20 to 30 minutes of brisk walking or exercise daily can do wonders.

vertical incisions are made behind the hairline. These provide access for scope and instruments to reset the muscles from underneath. The incisions are closed with a few dissolving stitches and are virtually invisible the day following surgery.

What is the Advantage of Minimal Incision Forehead Surgery Over Traditional Forehead Lifting?

Traditional forehead lifting involves making an incision from ear to ear across the scalp. This necessitates dividing the nerves that supply sensation to the scalp above the incision. The resulting numbness of the scalp usually resolves but not for months. The minimal incision technique laces the incisions between these nerves so there is no loss of sensation. Traditional forehead lifting accomplishes the lift by removing a strip of the scalp. This results in tension on the incision that can spread and leave a visible line where hair can't grow. The minimal incision technique shifts the brows to a higher point without removing any scalp. The tiny vertical incisions are not under any tension so hair loss around the incision is extremely rare. These incisions are usually closed with only a few dissolving sutures.

What if a Patient Wants Only the Outer Brows Lifted and Not the Entire Forehead?

The beauty of minimal incision surgery is that individual components of the forehead and brows can be changed without aflines can be improved without any other tact the office at (847) 304-1000.

lifting, or just the outer brows can be elevated to eliminate hooding of the eyelids without changing the position of the central brows. Traditional forehead lifting is an all or nothing proposition. The type of anesthesia employed depends on what is being done and the patient's preference.

What is the Recovery Period Like?

A cotton padded dressing is placed over the forehead and removed the next morning. There is usually some swelling but because the incisions are so small the swelling quickly resolves. Occasionally some bruising of the upper eyelids can result that usually resolves in seven to ten days. Our office makes an effort to stay on the forefront of the field of facial plastic surgery and we are currently using the KTP laser in many of the minimal incision surgeries.
