But I think everyone will agree, his artistic vision was highly idiosyncratic. To see the exhibition is, however, well worth the time.

Ivan Albright and Charles Rennie Mackintosh are featured in current exhibits at the Art Institute of Chicago. Charles Rennie Mackintosh is a Scottish designer-architect who died in 1928 amid obscurity. His designs are currently very popular and a piece of his furniture might now command more than \$1 million. Mackintosh was considered a leader of Art Nouveau in England and is associated with the Arts and Crafts Movement. His designs are elegantly simple, characterized by a strong linear, geometrical and vertical

One of Chicago's Greatest Painters

The work of Ivan Albright (1897-1983), a singular figure in American art and one of Chicago's most original painters, is now being shown in its most complete exhibition to date at The Art Institute of Chicago. Ivan Albright explores the full range and wondrous vision of this 20th-century American original with more than 120 paintings, sculptures, and works on paper. The retrospective opened on February 20, in celebration of the 100th anniversary of Albright's birth, and runs through May 11,

The works of Ivan Albright are hidden treasures in the history of 20th-century art. Visitors to the Art Institute can often be found crowding around his paintings, spellbound by his unusual still lifes, character studies, and self-portraits. These haunting compositions draw the viewer in, leading to fascinating discoveries of intricate detail, opulent color, and multiple vantage points. Although the friendly, elfin Albright was far from morbid himself, his artistic vision was highly idiosyncratic. He was fascinated by the passage of time and transience of matter, particularly the creative force of decomposition: "It matters little whether I paint a squash, a striped herring, or a man. The space, the light, the motion, the position have one thing in common-decay," he said.

Ivan Albright was born into a creative family in North Harvey, Illinois, on the southern edge of Chicago. His father was a popular painter, his mother a university graduate (in 1888), and his identical twin brother Malvin was also a sculptor and painter. Over the years, the Albright family had homes and studios in several towns around Chicago, including Hubbard Woods (now Winnetka) and Warrenville.

Albright served in World War I as a medical draftsman, documenting war wounds and operations for the army at a

He enrolled in the School of The Art Institute of Chicago in 1920, graduating in 1923 with an Honorable Mention in portrait and life painting. After graduation, Ivan and Malvin spent time in Philadelphia and New York, attending art classes and sharing studios before returning to their father's Warrenville studio in 1926.

Albright's paintings soon appeared in major museum exhibitions, winning prizes. By 1933, he had already shown his hospital in France. By the late 1920s, Albright was painting his studies of half-length figures that fill almost the entire canvas and present the features of the sitter greatly magnified. The artist enlarged every facial wrinkle, birthmark, and stray hair, and captured every blemish and bulge of exposed skin. Fleeting Time Thou Hast Left Me Old, 1928-29 (The Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York) and Flesh (Smaller than Tears are the Little Blue Flowers), 1928 (The Art Institute of Chicago) mercilessly describe their sitters' corrugated flesh, commenting uncompromisingly on the human condition.

Through long, poetic titles, he added interpretation to his art. In his meticulous attention to detail-often seen as grotesque but always infused with an underlying moral dimension—Albright was following the spirit of his favorite artists, Durer and Rembrandt. These concerns are masterfully rendered in two paintings in the permanent collection of the Art Institute: Into the World There Came a Soul Called Ida, 1928-30, and That Which I Should Have Done I Did Not Do (The Door), 1931-41. The latter required a studio set-up of scavenged props that took weeks to assemble and took Albright a decade to complete. He planned the composition in several notebooks and drew diagrams plotting the lines of vision and placement of objects. His technique was painstaking: sometimes he used a brush with only three hairs, and covered a square inch of canvas in a day. The Door established his technical mastery, while exposing death's corruption unfailingly.

In Albright's still-life compositions, he explores the expression of movement through space with reversals and combinations of perspective. Comments in his notebooks even reveal that, despite the artist's supposed realism, there is no single correct way to hang some of his paintings. Wherefore Now Ariseth the Illusion of a

Chicago) and Still Life with Potatoes in Motion, 1978-80 (Private Collection), as with many of his still lifes, may be turned in any direction and still offer visual bearing. The artist's supreme example of multiple perspective is achieved in a painting that took Albright 21 years to complete, and which bears one of the longest titles in art history: Poor Room-There is No Time, No End, No Today, No Yesterday, No Tomorrow, Only Forever, and Forever and Forever Without End (The Window), 1942-63 (The Art Institute of Chicago).

Albright achieved probably his greatest celebrity when he was commissioned to paint a portrait of the protagonist for the 1945 MGM film The Picture of Dorian Gray. Family in Crisis: the Ripple Effect

Some families may have more troubles than others. But to be sure, there are no "perfect" families that are without adversities, struggles, or pain. A healthy, well-functioning family is one whereby each of its members is functioning well individually and communicating interacting and working well together as a unit. It is a rare occurrence when all members of a family unit are at peak performance and there are no difficulties between any of its members. Life, by its very nature is tough and provides us with many adversities to overcome. The "normal" ebbs and flows of family life will include disputes, challenges to work through, moments of pain and sorrow and moments of pleasure and joy. Those individuals that have the strongest coping mechanisms will probably navigate through life's obstacle course differently than those who may not have developed the strength of useful coping

Crisis as the word implies means disaster, catastrophe, breakdown, ruin or devastation. Families in crisis are under tremendous stress and strain. This stress of one or more of its members tears at the very fabric of the relationships within the family. People are no longer responding as they normally might to everyday occurrences. Rules change and often the crisis becomes the "tail wagging the dog."

When one member is affected by a situation, condition or behavior the entire family is affected. As you throw a rock into a quiet pond, the ripples disturb the calm waters. Similarly, relationships are thrown off balance as stress levels increase. Children and adults respond differently to an emergency, threats or insecurity in their lives. Some may show remarkable changes in their personalties, while others seem to have no "outward" signs of distress. Some may have delayed or hidden reactions to the situation, perhaps creating a wound in life. Children can demonstrate behav- consultation.

All families have difficulties now and then. ior problems in school, poor academic performance, sleep disorders, or defiance. Adolescents under stress can "act out" their upset by rebelliousness, school truancy, sexual promiscuity, drug or alcohol abuse or vandalism. Parents can be preoccupied with the crisis and not be emotionally or physically available to their children. The "changes" that are noticed within the family around the time of a crisis are usually direct results of the crisis.

Any one of the following events or issues can throw a family into immediate

- · death of a spouse, parent or child
- · chronic illness/terminal illness
- alcoholism/substance abuse
- legal problems
- divorce
- domestic violence
- · emotional/verbal abuse
- sexual abuse
- eating disorders
- financial loss
- relocation
- · at risk adolescents

In my practice I work with families in crisis. My goal with a family is to help them assess the situation, provide objectivity and clarity, establish a plan to maneuver through the situation, identify resources that might be useful and available to individual members of the family, facilitate communication among members or outside sources and provide some techniques to help the family manage the stress more effectively.

If you and your family are struggling to survive a crisis, there is help and there is hope. Tough times don't last forever. Managing the crisis by keeping it in perspective, providing help and support for your family members, getting help from available resources to lend clarity and objectivity to your decision making, and taking care of yourself are all valuable reminders.







Adults and Fractured Teeth

As young people, many adults in the United States were not exposed to quality dentistry or could not afford it. We grew up prior to fluoridated water, sealants to prevent cavities in grooves, and before the current concepts of oral hy-

Almost every one had cavities. Dentists usually watched a cavity grow until it was large enough to warrant a silver filling or amalgam, as it is properly called. Placement of an amalgam at this point structurally weakened the tooth. Amalgams have poor compressive strength meaning that over time and under the pressure of biting and chewing, they crack and wear subjecting the remaining tooth to excessive forces. This is the reason that many adults frequently fracture their back teeth

In addition, as these amalgams age they corrode. The corrosion causes the edges of the filling itself to break down allowing entry of saliva and decay-causing bacteria into the tooth. Since these fillings were originally large and close to the tooth's nerve, these teeth often require root canal therapy after being exposed to the bacteria.

These problems are neither the fault of the dentist nor the patient. However, they can usually be prevented by the use of gold inlays instead of silver fillings at the time the cavity is initially detected. Gold calling 847-381-4040 in Barrington.

restorations are stronger and more resistant to wear then amalgams. Instead of wearing and cracking under the forces of biting and chewing, they maintain their integrity.

Once the damage is done, however, the dentist has limited options. They are forced to suggest a more expensive as well as extensive restoration such as a crown. Unfortunately, this is a fact in adult dental care. 

are the sun's invisible "burning" rays. They cause sunburn and skin cancer. The higher the UV index level the greater sun's UV rays are and the faster you will burn.

How much UV exposure reaches you depends: (1) time of day-10 a.m. to 2 p.m. is maximum, a good rule is "if shadow is shorter than you are take extra precaution" (2) season/altitude—the air is cleaner and thinner high up, "the higher the altitude the greater UV exposure" (3) where you live or visit—the closer to the equator the stronger the rays (4) length of time spent in the sun-don't forget to include doing daily activities, walking the dog, waiting for the bus, sunroof exposure as sun exposure.

Facts: (1) Protecting skin during the first 18 years can reduce risk of some types of cancer by 78%. (2) Cataracts are also associated with UV exposure. (3) Snow reflects sun back about 85% of UV rays.

Use sunscreen of an SPF 15 or higher whenever you spend time outdoors. Apply 1/2 hour before going out or apply daily to face and arms as you would make up in the morning.

Avoid tanning salons. Practice skin selfexamination: Skin growth increases in size and appears pearly, translucent, tan, black, brown or multicolored.

Mole changes in size, color or texture. Spot or growth continues to itch, hurt, crust, scab, erode or bleed. Open sore that lasts more than 4 weeks or heals and reopens.

Tips for Children: Don't use sunscreen on babies under 6 months. Keep in shade. Try fragrance-free-scents attract bugs. Use sunscreen while playing outdoors, don't forget ears, toes, nose and fingers. Make sure sitters know and follow your rules for sun protection. Some medications cause skin sun sensitivity. Avoid 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. exposure.





Impressionist Painter Alan Wolton Returns to The Studio of Long Grove

Art lovers who attended The Studio's first show for Alan Wolton last October had an opportunity to meet not only an extraordinary artistic talent, but an utterly charming man. Born in England and raised in South Africa, Wolton came to the U.S. 15 years ago to paint the magnificence of our mountains and coastal regions. A resident of Arizona, Alan has become well-established through the Southwest art market as an internationally-known impressionist painter.

In late January, we had the opportunity to spend three days in Sante Fe and Taos with this talented artist and his lovely wife, who gave us a personal tour of this major art market. Alan's reputation as one of the top living impressionist artists was very evident as we witnessed the reception he received among Santa Fe gallery owners and artists we met on this trip. Very much an artist's artist, Alan wins praise again and again for his excellent technique with oils and his powerful handling of the subject

An outdoorsman and an individualist from a young age, Wolton became discontented early on with formal artistic training. At age 20, a self-guided study of Britain's nineteenth century landscape artists, proved to be the path to developing the powerful, impressionistic style that has become characteristic of his work. Relocating to the U.S., Wolton felt he was "finally coming home"—the rugged scenery of the Southwest with its heat, dryness and brilliant light provides inspiring subject matter, and he has found the artistic freedom to concentrate on a pure expression of nature's beauty. "I am a man of the outdoors," he says. Through countless hours spent in the mountains and at the seashore, Wolton has "stalked his landscapes, hunting for the most picturesque or dramatic views." His paintings, which are created indoors in his studio, evolve from the mood evoked while in the wild-from a certain sparkle in a mountain stream, ruffled leaves in the wind, or the crash of ocean waves on jagged

cliffs. The memories of the initial emotional response he finds in nature typically take time to develop in his mind into a vision of the finished painting. Only when he knows what the final appearance of the painting will be, does he begin to paint—often feverishly and to the point of exhaustion. "I'm remembering the mood," he says, "the power and the purpose, not the actual linear design." And although Wolton has become known for monumental-sized works, even his smaller paintings express this power.

His impressionist techniques—the use of pure and brilliant splashes of color, and a warm underglow of bright color shining through transparent layers of paint-allow Wolton to powerfully articulate the emotional vibrance and fury of nature. In describing one of his land- he presents over fifty spectacular original scapes, he points out that "when you get paintings.

up close, you'll see these tremendous sweeps of brilliant color and, really, you're not quite sure what they represent. But when you step back, there's a vitality and a suggestion of mood or power within the landscape and if that strength was not there, the painting would not carry."

In discussing his artistic motivation, Wolton summarizes, "If I have an obsession in my art, it is to bring a feeling of warmth into the heart of the viewer, to produce a painting with such tremendous appeal that it is not judged, it is felt." If customer response at The Studio is any indication, it would appear that he has accomplished this objective quite well. 



Medical and Financial Decisions by Guardians by Sharon L. Keller, J.D.

To ensure that an individual's financial planning and medical treatment will conform with his or her desires, the individual should execute the appropriate documents; i.e. a Living Will and Durable Power of Attorney for Property. However, in many cases the incapacitated individual may never have executed the type of legal documents that would enable others to handle his or her affairs. Therefore, the necessary action must be taken by someone, such as a guardian or conservator. Under the doctrine of substituted judgment, a guardian or conservator makes decisions on behalf of the incapacitated

For example, assume that the wife of an elderly couple finds that her husband is suffering from dementia and cannot communicate or swallow. The nursing home has told her it is time to consider a feeding tube and she wants to know whether she can direct them not to do so. Unless an agent is permitted to exercise some kind of independent decision making, an incapacitated person may effectively be prevented from taking certain actionsespecially with regard to health care decision making and financial or estate planning. For example, the incapacitated person may be unable to make gifts to take advantage of the gift tax annual exclusion. Or, medical treatment might be administered that is inappropriate or un-

To remedy this, the courts have come to rely on the old English doctrine of substituted judgment. A well-known instance of substituted judgment is the case of Karen Ann Quinlan, who had suffered irreversible brain damage and was being maintained in a persistent vegetative state with the assistance of a respirator. After much time and effort, the courts finally concluded that Karen's family could exercise their best judgment as to what she would wish under the circumstances.

individual's intent, allow substituted judgment decisions to be made when less than clear proof of intent is available under limited circumstances. In the Estate of Longeway, the Illinois courts approved the use of substituted judgment only where the patient was terminally ill and had an irreversible condition. Substituted judgment is only available after a court has heard relevant testimony and evidence and then makes a decision This can be a very lengthy and time consuming process. Although the doctrine of substituted judgment has been applied by the courts, its exercise may be limited to situations where the court finds that there is clear evidence of the individual's desires or in the absence of such evidence on what the guardian views as the individual's best interests. To prevent this situation, you should make sure that you and your loved ones have executed the necessary documents that will speak for you when you are no longer able to make your desires known.





Interesting Atmosphere, Wonderful Food



You can almost smell the salt air as you set foot into Port Edward Restaurant. In our indoor harbor floats the 25 foot "Porpoise" sailboat built in 1934 by Bond Boat Builders in Chicago. The Porpoise was Tony Bond's personal boat and was designed by his close friend and associate, naval architect John Deering. The strong and large wooden hull would have made her a fine fishing vessel at the turn of the century. But now our unique Porpoise is to dine one or two couples graciously in her cabin... a true unique dining adventure!

Our indoor harbor is New England inspired. To the south by the Colony House of Newport, Rhode Island North, by the old Union Oyster House in Boston, and

the picturesque Fisherman's Lobster Dock Shacks of old Penobscot Bay, Maine.

The huge timbers, joists and decking were salvaged from an old Milwaukee cheese factory and the old Starck Piano Company warehouse of Chicago. The strong timbers are virgin cutting of long leaf yellow pine, no longer available commercially. Three McHenry County barns were used for planking and hand hewn timbers for the Salem Lounge and Wine cellar. The old 1920's windmill dividing the lobby and the lounge was saved from destruction by Edward and provided an intimate setting for "popping the question" or romantic dining.

Our lounge overlooking the beautiful

Seven Gables of Salem, Massachusetts. Salem's obsession with witchcraft in 1692 motivated the building of a secret room and stairs for the safety of the owner's sisters to provide a hideout from the "burning at the stake" witch hunters. We too have a secret room in the lounge. Look and see if you can find it. In the far end of the restaurant is the Navigator's Room with an outstanding collection of hard hat diving helmets, whaling harpoons, lances and an old jaw bone of a Sperm Whale. Hanging from the ceiling are oars from World War II Liberty Ship life boats.

We are celebrating Port Edward's 32nd anniversary this year with Edward's continuous hand on the helm. Interestingly, in 30 years of serving Alaskan King Crab Legs, Port Edward's suppliers have calculated that put end to end, the crab legs will have gone around the world during our celebration.


The encrusted cannons by the entry are of Spanish origin, circa 1680, from the Caribbean and the double ship's wheel is from an Alaskan ice breaker. The coral encrusted anchor in front of our indoor harbor was hauled up from the east coast of the Florida Keys and a few steps away, an old diver's two man pump from Montreal, Canada in excel-

Fox River was inspired by the House of lent working order. Just up to the side of it is a battered French ship's figure head from the turn of the 17th century. Throughout the restaurant is a collection of English antique nautical signs, rare "lead top" and 18th century binnacles, Edward Wolowiec's original paintings and nautical artifacts too numerous to mention. Whimsical (Hwim'zi kel) Webster defines whimsical as: "Given to fanciful notions; capricious", but doesn't the term imply so much more?




Connect with the South Island and the Southwest



God or damage by others. If the owner elects to enter into a separate contract for maintenance services, all plant materials, except annuals will be guaranteed for the length of the contract.


