

Beautiful Dzeams Becomins Realities

Theresa and her fellow Japanese artists have recently opened their own studio in Kumamoto and she has had two exhibitions in a Kumamoto City gallery. She plans to participate in an international exhibition in Tokyo this month with more exhibitions to follow. Behind Ms. Mura is a washi fan (of handmade paper), one of her designs.

Many of us have dreams to fulfill. Many of these dreams will never be realized. A mined to make that dream a reality. Theresa Mura is one such person.

Theresa, daughter of Romeo and Catherine Mura of Lake Barrington and a 1986 graduate of Barrington High School, now lives in Kumamoto, Japan and has for the past 21/2 years.

Ms. Mura has begun her third year as a professor at I.E.C. University in Yatsushiro, Japan where she teaches a variety of different subjects including Eastern and Western cultures to high level English speaking Japanese students. She also offers private lessons in conversational English.

In addition to learning and appreciating courageous few persevere and are deter-the Japanese culture, Theresa is there to study Nihon-ga (Traditional Japanese painting), Shodo (Japanese calligraphy), Yakimono (Japanese pottery) and Ikebana (Japanese floral arranging).

Theresa explains that the Japanese style of painting is done on paper (torinoshi) not canvas. The paper is treated with dosa (a glue substance) which keeps the pigments from soaking in the paper. The results are very vibrant colors! You then outline the image in sumi ink. The colors, or pigments, are granular form-with sand to rock consistencies. The larger rocks are ground. This newly created material will have the same consistency as water colors or acrylic, but doesn't look like either and will range from transparent to thick.

Theresa and her fellow Japanese artists have recently opened their own studio in downtown Kumamoto. She has had two exhibitions of her Nihon-ga paintings at the trendy shopping and art gallery district of Kumamoto City. This month she plans to participate in an international exhibition in Tokyo. In November she will have her third exhibition in Kumamoto with two more exhibitions planned for June and September

In Kumamoto Ms. Mura plans to open a branch office of the Japan International Foreign Artists Club (J.I.A.C.) based in Tokyo. The purpose of the J.I.A.C. is to develop 381-5745.

Niva (glue) and hot water are then added. and improve their art through the exhibition of their work, to promote mutual understanding and cooperation between countries, and to contribute to the prosperity of humankind and the achievement of world

> In addition to overcoming the communication differences and cultural differences, which according to Theresa is a daily challenge, she has indeed accomplished much.

> Her travels have also taken her to Hong Kong, Thailand, Korea and Guam.

What are her plans for the future? She will pursue graphic design and teaching Japanese style painting—and perhaps open a gallery in the not-too-far-distant future. For this young woman it is a given she will make this dream a reality.





Golf Tips By Ray—The Old Pro

Golf Equipment

Don't be mislead—proper fitting clubs are a definite aid to good golf. Things to be considered in selecting a set of clubs are length, total weight, balance, lie, grip diameter, and angle and loft.

In helping our customers select clubs, we consider their stature-length of arms and legs, size of hands, and general strength.

The weight and length of the clubs are worked out to suit each individual. Personally, I recommend as much length as can be controlled and as much weight as can be handled without causing one to sacrifice clubhead speed.

I believe most players should have clubs with a bit of spring or whip in the shaft and the weight concentrated in the clubhead so that they will have a definite feel of the clubhead. However, I do not recommend extremely whippy shafts except for senior players if they are very slow swingers. The shafts of irons should be a bit firmer than in the woods. The club with head balance or head feel encourages smooth swinging as one will sense, thus it is not necessary to exert strength to attain clubhead speed. In other words, you allow the club to help

The lie of the club is the angle between the shaft and the sole. Tall players should use clubs with a reasonably upright lieplayers who are 5'9" - 5'10" would find a Soft hands swinging the clubhead will promedium lie most desirable. Shorter players should favor a club with a flatter lie.

Dreading The School Days

sobs, looking up at you with her wide eyes and tear-streaked face, begging for mercy. Or, clutching his stomach in feigned agony, your son cries, "I feel sick-I can't go to school today!"

The first day of the school year should be an exciting time of new clothes, new teachers and new friends to look forward to. Why is it that some children dread starting school in the fall?

According to Dr. Raymond Huntington, founder and president of the Huntington Learning Center, there are many reasons why children may be reluctant, or even frightened, about returning to the classroom. A new environment can be a tremendous adjustment for a youngster, whether they are moving from one school to another or simply going into a new classroom with unfamiliar students and a different teacher. However, children may also have a particular attitude towards school which creates their intense fear:

1. Lack of self confidence—"I can't do it!" If a child does not believe in himself, he may not think he is capable of succeeding in school. To build your child's confidence, set reasonable expectations and attainable goals, and praise your child's can complete small tasks, they will not be learning may see school as a chore, like a

"No! I don't wanna go!" your daughter afraid to move on to bigger and better challenges.

2. Fear of failure or fear of criticism from others—"You can't do it - you're stupid!" Children who are having trouble keeping up in school may feel afraid or embarrassed to ask questions in class, for fear that their classmates will tease them. When they do not ask for help, this fear of failure often causes students to fall further and further behind in school.

3. Lack of motivation—"I won't do it!" When a child is unmotivated, he would rather avoid a difficult task than face it headon. Sometimes, children become bored or disinterested when "textbook knowledge" seems meaningless. The key to motivating a child to learn is to make learning interesting. Find examples in everyday life and children will learn without even trying! Reading food boxes and cans, counting cars on the highway, and writing letters to friends are things that we do every day, but activities such as these can spark a child's interest in learning. Other times, a child may just give up without trying if they think they cannot do the work. Again, show the child all of the little things he can accomplish and he will be more likely to take on larger tasks.

4. Negative attitude about learningachievements. When a child finds that they Children who have a negative attitude about criminal who has been sentenced to 13 years knowledge will fall into place, then self conof hard labor! As a parent, you can change this bad attitude by making learning enjoyable. Set an example by taking an interest in learning yourself. Reading with your child and helping them with their homework are only two things you can do. Your child will be enthusiastic about going to school when they see that learning can be fun!

5. Lack of basic skills—"I don't know how to do it!" You child will certainly be frustrated if they cannot keep up with their classmates or school assignments due to a lack of basic skills. If your child was having problems at the end of the school year, they may have even more difficulty with the introduction of new material. By working on a child's weak areas through tutoring,
