April 1969

The April meeting of Rebecca Circle was held at 9:30 a.m. at the church, with 16 members and two guests present. Devotions were given by Judy Bettsworth.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved as corrected. Correspondence consisted of a letter from Mrs. Bethel Fleming, at the American mission in Nepal, thanking the circle for the box of baby clothes, dry food, etc. which we sent in the winter. Maryanne said we should ask Betty Lincoln whether two boxes were sent or just one.

The treasurer's report showed a balance on hand of \$53.93. In the absence of the treasurer, Marj Nelson, Maryanne reported that the \$100 donation has been turned over to Lake Bluff, and that Marje turned over \$131 in WSCS pledges from our circle. She also announced that Marje and her family were moving back to California, and asked that the secretary send a goodbye note from the circle.

From the WSCS Board Meeting notes: Monday, May 5, is the annual Lake Bluff luncheon. Kathy Joy stated that this year's luncheon will be at the Art Institute, since both institutions are celebrating their 75th anniversaries. Tickets are \$5, and reservations must be in by May 1. (5) Jane Farra would like volunteers for entertaining new members in their homes. (6) Rummage Sale - volunteers are needed for fixing baked goods and food for the noon meals on ~~Fri.~~ Fri. and Sat. (the confirmands will be cleaning up on Sat. and need a good lunch). A sheet was passed around for circle members to sign up for duty at the rummage sale.

Ruth Anne Baumeister, one of our guests, reported on Vacation Church School, sponsored by the Barrington area churches and held the last two weeks in June (Tues-Fri.) from 9:00 to 12:00. Volunteer teachers from our church are needed desperately.

Maryanne read a letter from Mrs. Anna Mae Earles, Supervisor of Volunteer Services in Cook County. The letter answered questions concerning the possibility of our providing funds (over and above tuition, board and other standard costs) for foster children attending college. This would entail one circle member, or perhaps a committee, sending money and writing once a month to the student. It was suggested that we take this on as an additional pro-

ject next year, and that we have Mrs. Earles or a Mrs. McFarland out to speak to us in the fall.
