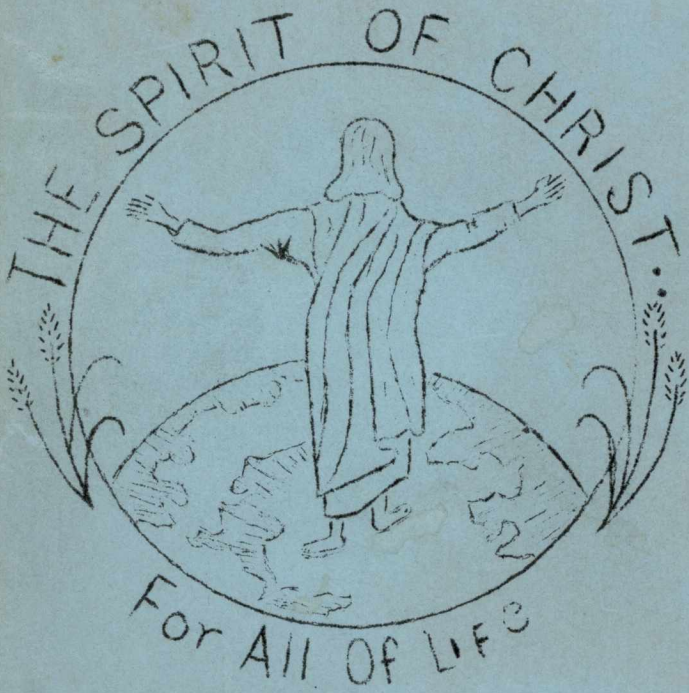

PURPOSE

The purpose of the Woman's Society of Christian Service shall be to unite all the women of the church in Christian living and service; to help develop and support Christian work among women and children around the world; to develop the spiritual life; to study the needs of the world; to take part in such service activities as will strengthen the local church, improve civic, community, and world conditions. To this end this organization shall seek to enlist women, young people, and children in the Christian fellowship, and to secure funds for the activities in the local church and the support of the work undertaken at home and abroad for the establishment of a world Christian community.

OUR GIVING

The funds of our Society are made up of money voluntarily given by the members through the Circles and by the proceeds of such projects as rummage sales, dinners, and special events undertaken for the purpose of earning money.

One half of our budget is designated for benevolences. These include (1) the pledge to the Woman's Division of the Rock River Conference, (2) Conference related and Community giving, (3) Missionary and Conference giving.

A partial list of Conference related and Community giving includes (1) Lake Bluff Orphanage (2) Methodist Old Peoples Home (3) Wesley Memorial Hospital (4) Halsted Street Institutional Church (5) Bethany Home (6) Camp Reinberg and many others.

The institutions to which we give under Missionary and Conference giving are (1) Peek Home (2) Marcy Center (3) Newberry Ave. Center (4) Esther Hall.
