Illinois Republicans, Unable to Break the Deadlock, Adjourn.

EIGHTY-EIGHT OPPOSE MOTION

Strong-Voiced Disasters Force a Roll Call on the Proposition, Which Results in 1414 Yeas to 88 Nays, and Delegates Depart.

Springsfield, Ill., May 28.—The Republican state convention took place Friday night May 27 at 8 o'clock. One hour and fifteen minutes of the morning session and the motion for a recess offered by Senator Charles of Mendota, was carried by 82 yeas and 88 nays, which majority, only 58 votes being recorded against it.

C. P. Gardner of the La Salle county, by declaration, known as "Bony" Gardner, jumped to his feet and shouted "Adjourn!"
