That Mr West acquitted himself with marked success in his responsible position is the unanimous testimony of all who came in contact with him in the engrossing campaign just closed. For the services so efficiently and so acceptably rendered he should receive the credit which is his due.

Mr. W. was usually seconded in his duties by Ir J. A. Wheeler of Springfield, the alert and energetic secretary of the committee. Mr. W. was also aided much by his geniality and tact in removing possible appetites and to put the committee in a position to do its duty. By his assiduous attention to details he was able to relieve the chairman of the committee of much of the burden of the work. He was also in personal charge of the matter of final nomination papers and for his successful management of the committee he received commendation. This task requires the greatest of care and absolute accuracy and was performed without an error. He was also in charge of the work done by those familiar with the work.

What the committee most intimately associated with, Chairman W. was the campaign for the election of the committee. This consisted of Charles P. Hitch, James McKinley, Charles C.
