The water works system of this village is more than self supporting. During the past year the cost of operating was \$2,833.01 and the receipts were \$3,076.24. leaving a surplus in the water fand of \$22,73. Of course to this amount should be added so much for each hydrant, usually figured at \$25. where water is furnished by a private company, as a protection to property against loss by fire. Since our water work system was installed we have not had a serjection of the fire department. In fact there has been saved by the prompt action of the fire department. The Chicago & North-Western Ry. company paid for water consumed during the year \$1,285.74, which is more than \$100 per month. The profit to the village on this one account is \$21.45 for the year and still some of our eftienes complain that the company is getting its water too cheapiy. They are the best consumer we have. They pay for what they use.
