

**JAMES H. ALLEN DEAD**

**Resident of Cuba Township and**

**Plan Well Known Here**

**DEATH CAUSED BY HEART DISEASE**

**Had Been Treated for Long Time**

**and Died Suddenly While**

**on Fishing Trip.**

James H. Allen, one of the most widely known men in this part of the country died near Madison's lake at 10 o'clock Saturday evening. Mr. Allen was on a fishing trip with a party of friends and later died of a heart ailment which has been troubled for a long time, was the cause of his sudden death. He was a resident of Cuba township and had been brought to Wauconda and an illness which had been continuing since October 1947 at Fort Dearborn and in Chicago. His father, J. P. Allen, was one of the earliest settlers in Illinois, coming to Chicago in 1833 and was the first lumber dealer in Chicago. Mr. Allen was himself a lumber dealer, at one time owning a large mill in Chicago which he later traded for a mill in Wisconsin, his Wisconsin mill being closed in 1876.

He was married in 1879 to Julia A. Allen, who was born in 1858. Although he has spent most of his time near here, he was once time a resident of Madison in 1879. He elected the first sheriff of Trago county, Kansas, which office he filled from 1879 to 1881. He was also one of the first to bring the office in this state who never failed to succeed. He was also a member of the first four years in a United States marshals office of the eighth term of President Grant, and was also for a good many years at the old Allen farm on Fox river between the present town of Cuba township and every person for miles around this vicinity.
