WILSON ON STAND

SECRETARY OF AGRICULTURE
CLASHES WITH PINCHOT OVER
DOLLIVER LETTER.

SCENE IN BALLINGER CASE

Former Forester Testifies He Had
Superior's Consent Washington
Committee to Repeal
Taft Letter Read.

Washington—Gifford Pinchot and Secretary Wilson Thursday clashed dramatically before the Ballinger-Pinchot trial.

Mr. Pinchot asserted he secured Secretary Wilson's permission to write a letter to Senator George W. Ballinger, taking the stand, declared with great emphasis he never did and would never have written the letter without writing of such a letter. He never saw the letter or heard of it until today.

Resuming his testimony before the investigating committee, Mr. Pinchot read a letter from President Taft, dated November 24, 1909, replying to Mr. Ballinger's letter. In the letter Mr. Taft said he could not endorse with Mr. Pinchot's views a to Mr. Ballinger's letter, but that he agreed with Mr. Ballinger's difference with some of the things Mr. Garfield had done, and that he had written to Mr. Ballinger on the part of Mr. Ballinger toward the cause of conservation.

The president, however, had not shaken his confidence in the good faith of Secretary Wilson, and had written to him in defense of the cause of conservation.

Asked as to what impression he left with Senator Wilson, and upon him, Mr. Pinchot said the impression was good.

"Wilson had been impressed on the ground that his charges against Mr. Ballinger were well founded," he said. "When we now know they were far from bases."

Mr. Pinchot proceeded to describe his thoughts following these events and Mr. Ballinger's evidence that he was instrumental in causing the writing of the letter to Senator Ballinger, after which President Taft had written to him.

"I have a letter from Secretary Wilson," he declared, "in which he says, 'When and where you give credit to the Ballinger letter,' said Chairman Nelson.

A member of the committee, asked for the complete provenance of Mr. Wilson's letter, was silent.

When Secretary Wilson arrived, he took a seat beside Chairman Nelson. Mr. Pinchot then rose into evidence and read his letter to the committee.

Mr. Pinchot was asked to explain his statement in the letter that President Taft had written to him. He declared that before the committee showed Mr. Ballinger knew more about the subject than he did, and that any other man in the service and present to receive the various documents presented to receive the various documents.

Mr. Pinchot declared he thought the greater part of the letter had taken the form of a memorandum and had been read by Mr. Ballinger.

The Glavis charge he made no reference to, he said. He had been instrumental in clearing the Custerington claims on the strength of the Love report, which he had not been asked to warrant such action.

"If a subordinate had taken the greater part of the letter, he would have cabled the witness dramatically. I would have dismissed him—either he would have been given a chance, and he wouldn't have cabled which but the president made no reference to that act."

TRAIN CAUGHT IN SLIDE

Fear Expressed for Safety of Passengers on Great Northern Express—Slated to Stop.

Portland, Ore.—A train was recovered here that the Great Northern Railway knew express, which had been stalled since the west end of the tunnel on the south side of the Columbia River range since Thursday.
