HAS PROVED VALUE

PASSAGE OF PAYNE TARIFF BILL
ALREADY JUSTIFIED.

Not One Single Feature of the Bill
Has Disappointed the People
of Its Friends—Large
Net Income Gained.

In two important respects the PAYNE tariff has more than met the expectations of its friends. The bill has been correspondingly disappointed in its critics and the agitators who are working to defeat it.

We refer to its power as a revenue producer and the effect of its maximum protection.

Under the first eight months operation of the new tariff, talk of the first nine months of the current fiscal year, the revenue receipts from the new tariff were nearly a net increase of \$8,500,000,000, or an apparent

gain of \$1,000,000,000.

So, instead of the once dreaded deficit, the prospect is for a substantial increase in revenue, and the bill has paid off.

But that without reckoning in the large expected receipts from the new tariff, which are now seen clearly superfluous as a revenue producer.

As a revenue producer the PAYNE tariff has proved a success.

Now as to its operation as a new experiment or as an experiment in the tariff plan. How about the direct protection of the home market, the maximum and minimum scales?

Why, great attention, of course, has been given to the question of how to operate as a club of protection to war, the conditional protection of the home market, the maximum potential producer, and practically every conceivable commercial power has been used to determine the scale in its operation.

It has been agreed that the "most favored nation principle" of the "clubs" will not be used, as far as possible.

So far from involving us in war of tariff negotiations with Germany and Canada, the new tariff has paved the way for better and smoother and practically rectangular trade with these countries, and it is now seen that the secret tariff standard of the old tariff schedule was to the best of our knowledge, a club of protection to war, the conditional protection of the home market, the maximum potential producer, and practically every conceivable commercial power has been used to determine the scale in its operation.

It is agreed that the scale as a tax, or its bearing on consumers, the protection of the home market, the improvement on the tariff it dispenses and the president has already started to work on the new tariff, and is at work to secure still further improvements in that direction on tariff committee, and the new tariff committee, which we can reach really scientific tariff making in this country.

BREAKS AIR RECORD

CURTIS MAKES REMARKABLE FLIGHT FROM ALBANY TO NEW YORK CITY.

WINS A PRIZE OF \$10,000

Aviator Wins \$10,000 Prize
Flight of Hudson River Then Rises Again to Great Height—Makes One Stop.

Glen H. Curtis was a 1000-mile aviator from the New York World when he made his record flight from Albany to New York Sunday.

The flight from Albany to New York was covered in 1 hour and 45 minutes, and in two hours and thirty-five minutes from Albany to New York Sunday.

The aviator, who had been flying for two hours and thirty-five minutes, and in the earth's atmosphere.

His average speed for the distance—1000 miles—was 100 miles per hour, and record ever made by an aviator in a long distance flight, and in his entirety he had a record of 3 hours and 50 minutes, and he had attempted a heavier than air machine.

The start was made from Albany at 7:00 o'clock under weather conditions which were favorable. The aviator could only demand a few hours and twenty-three minutes later he had reached New York, and at 10:30 P.M. Gloucester, where there was an hour's stop. The aviator left Gloucester at 8:30 A.M. and he had stopped at the boundary of Massachusetts.

Curtis' flight from London to Gloucester was a miles—described the Curtis flight as being one of speed and danger. The Frenchman's average speed was 100 miles per hour, and Curtis followed the winding course of the Atlantic coast, and the steep, wooded slopes and treacherous passes. He was flying high over the great bridge, and within fifty feet of the river, breaking the water, and jolted like a fan on the turns.

Only once did the aviator show any evidence of trouble, and that was when King, near West Point, where, at a height of nearly 10,000 feet, a thunderous roar was heard, and the white clouds dropped like a roof for 40 feet and 100 yards. The aviator, Curtis, who was flying by instinct, managed to hold his lever, brought renewed equilibrium to his plane.

ALMA KELLNER FOUND SLAIN

Kidnaped Louisville Girl is Believed to Have Been the Victim of Murder.

Louisville, Ky.—The dismembered body of Alma Kellner, the eighteen-year-old daughter of Dr. and Mrs. L. Kellner, who disappeared from her home last December, was found Monday morning in a room at St. John's Catholic Church, at Clay and Washington streets.
