

Grass Lands in Grain.
Humus-making crops are such
as turnips, clover, blue grass,
buckwheat, etc. When these have
been grown, the land is under
better conditions of moisture and
fertilization than land that has grown
grain continuously.

When a team has been used to
till the land, the soil should be
left dry, but should be rubbed dry
as chills, fevers and other diseases
are caused by the soil being too wet
when it dries.
