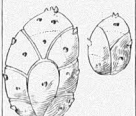

HOW SEED POTATOES ARE CUT

In Large Specimen Shows Cuts Are Made Just Above Each Eye in Downward Direction.

The means by which the blight is spread from plant to plant is the chief question which interests the shippers and planters of seed potatoes.



Cutting Seed Potatoes. Here, says Green's Pott Grower, "This is exactly in tubers which show the dry rot. These carry the fungus, a water-borne state, which develops after the tuber is planted and spreads to the leaves of the growing plants. The potatoes have the matter entirely in the woody tissue, it has no buds on all seed potatoes and plants only when there will be no danger of introducing late blight with them regardless of the amount of blight which is carried on the surface of the tubers. In the largest specimen shown in the illustration the cuts are made just above each eye and in a downward direction to the best support to the future sprout."

CORD TO STOP INTERFERENCE

Contrivance So Arranged That Horse's Feet Do Not Strike Each Other in Trotting



To prevent "interference," a contrivance is just shown to keep the feet from striking. Interference has spoiled many a horse that would otherwise make good money on the track, but with this device the fault is effectively overcome.

CARD GAMES PASTOR'S BANE

"Affinity" and Pictures in Dark Room
 Figure in the West of Rev. Mr. Tillman and Wife.

Women, card games in the parlor and a photographic "dark room" figured in the marital woes of Rev. Thaddeus Tillman, former pastor of the Reformed Lutheran Evangelical church at Lake Zurich, according to testimony before Judge Cannon in the Election street court, Chicago, by Mrs. Tillman, who is suing her husband on a charge of wife abandonment.

The minister filed suit for divorce March 20, charging that his wife's actions had resulted in his being driven from his pulpit. He charged that she failed to have herself with a view to gain the sympathy of neighbors and that she had become a gambler.

The name of "Minnie," a shopgirl, with whom it is alleged, the former pastor in formerly, was mentioned by Mrs. Tillman.

After much of the testimony had been heard, the court continued the case until May 3, entering an order for Tillman to pay his wife \$3 a week in the meantime.

Mrs. Tillman is a tall, dark-haired woman of southern Missouri, well educated and cultured. She told her story rather impressively and fearlessly.
