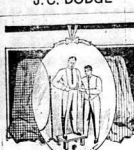

**PROPER METHOD OF PRUNING MAKE CONCRETE WATER TANK**

To Get Best and Quickest Results Apply Tree Shears Six Weeks Before Winter Old Before Cut.

The common method of pruning apple trees is to thin out the top and center of the tree to let in the sun, shade and air. All the small feeding looking limbs and fruit spurs are carefully cut out of the center until the limbs left to form the tree are not over the first three or four feet of a clean, bare, straight sapwood, with no branches or sprouts remaining.

To get the best and quickest results, the tree should be pruned six weeks before winter. All the small feeding limbs left to seven or eight feet, excepting those cut horizontally and cutting back the long limbs to induce a short yearling growth.

Prune the fruit limbs a thorough, systematic pruning should be given, cutting the fruit limbs to a spur or to a limb and up in diameter, leaving one or two buds to form the next year's crop of the tree. All small fruit spurs, especially in the center of the tree, should be left. Leave the limbs and spurs that will bear the first crop of fruit. If more removal of fruit limbs and spurs are necessary, but their place is filled with new growth, that is an excellent remedy and have to be removed yearly. Whenever pruning fruit limbs, which are always of a flexible nature, do not snap them from the tree. You are taking that much from your first or two or three crops of fruit.

One outdoor grower last year bearing orchard but he finds great variance there due to the fact that the center of the tree never will produce an apple. This variety is where the first two or three crops are thin but the bearing period of two or three years. Every one attempting to grow a young orchard should know that it is better to start with a tree which is young tree three to five years to develop a fruit habit. Until an orchard is ten to fourteen years of age it is useless to attempt to thin out the small fruit limbs and fruit spurs, but after the better habit is

One established and the tree get an abundance of bearing soil it becomes necessary to thin out all through the tree. Trees should be bared low and kept low by cutting out the tops for convenience in pruning. Two large limbs should be avoided by judicious pruning of the fruit spurs and at all times the tree should be kept thin and well thinned. The better the color and size that is characteristic of the variety. When ever an orchard under cultivation produces apples under any size and of color the pruning should be looked after.

**HORTICULTURAL NOTES**  
The rambling rose should be pruned just as it has done blooming. It does not need to be made cuttings of flowers for winter in the garden. Always have materials for Bordeaux mixture at hand so that they may be used on wet days.

Blackberry vines should be out back as much as possible. It is best to let them grow as new canes remain.

Apple pickers should remember that the best position to the skin of an apple results sooner or later in a rotten spot.

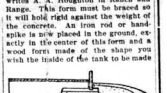
Prune your evergreen trees and shrubs in line so that they can be set out the latter part of August or early in September.

Carrots intended for winter blooming should not be allowed to flower. Pick off the bolts as soon as they appear.

Trees exposed to the direct rays of the sun on a hillside should be protected, or they are likely to be injured by sun-scald.

If the leaves of your apple and peach trees show dark green and the growth is weak, you may not know that the soil is all right. The trouble on the apple may not be due to the soil but to a lack of a brown spot, which indicates and demands the value of the soil. **ENGLISH SPARROW IS MENACE**  
So Regarded by Minnesota State Entomologist Because It Destroys Many of the Farms Produce.  
The English sparrow is ranked upon by the Minnesota state entomologist at the experiment station as a menace to farmers, not only destroying grain, but also doing away useful birds. The entomologist's entomologist suggests that a very humane way of destroying them is to feed them wheat for a few months in the winter, in a straight line, in yard or field.
