SCENE IN BALLENGER CASE

Former Purveyor of Mail Has Reporter's Comments—Washington Committee Hearings

Washington.—Clifford Pinchot and Secretary Wilson Tuesday clashed dramatically before the Hallinger-Pinchot investigation committee. Mr. Pinchot asserted he secured Secretary Wilson's permission to write to Senator Dolliver. Secretary Pinchot's taking the case to the press with great emphasis he never did and never would have consented to the writing of such a letter. He never saw the letter or heard of it until he read the article.

Resuming his testimony before the investigating committee, Mr. Pinchot read a letter from President Taft, November 17, 1902, and the witness' letter of November 4. Mr. Taft said he could not coincide with Mr. Pinchot's views as to Mr. Ballinger and declared that the fact that the Hallinger letter was one of the things Mr. Garfield had done, did not make a lack of fraud on the part of Mr. Hallinger so serious on the cause of conservation. The witness stated also that Mr. Pinchot's statement had not shaken his confidence in the good faith of Secretary Ballinger and his hearty interest in the cause of conservation.

Asked as to what impression the receipt of the letter had upon him, Mr. Pinchot said the impression was that:

"I was indignant because I had been denied on the ground that he charges against me. I was angry because I had been told 'when we know you were far from innocent'."

The witness proceeded to describe the conversation which took place and it became evident that he was leaning up to the circumstances of the writing of the letter. Senator Dolliver, after which President Taft notified Mr. Pinchot's confession.

"I have a letter from Secretary Wilson which he desires to be present when any testimony is given as to the Dolliver letter," said Chairman Nelson in a message we now reproduce in the immediate presence of Mr. Wilson.

When Secretary Wilson arrived he said he would like to see Mr. Pinchot. Mr. Pinchot then read into evidence his letter to Senator Dolliver.

Mr. Pinchot was asked to explain his statement in the letter that Theodore Tatt had been misled. It developed that evidence before the committee showed that the secretary knew more about the "Funningham claim" than he had admitted in his report and proceeded to recite the various facts that had come out at the hearing.

Mr. Pinchot declared he thought the president had been misled because in his letter of December 18, 1902, the Gladis charge he made Mr. Pinchot's name as the Hallinger action clearing the Cunningham claim.

"The strength of the Lane evidence which Lane himself did not read as warranted his action."

"I as administrator of mine had taken the action Mr. Hallinger took," declared the witness, "and I would have dismissed him either for corruption or incompetency and I wouldn't have cared which. But the president made no reference to that."

TRAIN CAUGHT IN SLIDE
