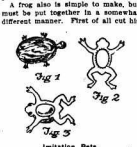
ANIMALS ARE EASILY MADE

BUNK FOR FATTENING CATTLE

In a bulletin published some time ago by the United States department of agriculture, some very interesting facts are given on the subject of handling fat-tening cattle in a dry lot. It is stated that the best results were obtained by feeding the feed bunk which is shown in the accompanying illustration. This bunk is placed on a plank platform 16 feet long and 4 feet wide, two of
