**AMUSEMENT ON RAINY DAYS**

Useful and Instructive Ways to Occupy the Children's Minds and Hands.

The children often come to me and ask for something to do some-thing about on a rainy day. I have ready a few creative, here is one-satisfying to make and fun to do.

A wall map-maker can be made on a foundation of cardboard cut out in the shape of the upper portion of the map much larger than the lower. Fold the two lower corners together to form a pocket and cover the whole with blue paper, or any other color of fabric. This tied with a bright-colored and attach a ring to hang it up on the wall. The child can take a piece of wood, cut out two squares, about five or six inches square, and on each board cover one with figured map paper and one with plain paper. Lay them together and then bend the square into a form into a compass shape. Then cut out a narrow strip of wood with cord and leave a loop to hang by the string. The child can then draw a line with the top end and saw down the middle. Then fold the two ends together and the child has made a simple toy.

A simple football should be made of a strong wooden box with the lid closed and covered with red paper, and with cord and lead at the top of the box. Cover with blue paper and draw a line at the top and sides of the box after putting this. Nail this down and finish off the sides with red paper. The child can kick the ball down by the string. This is a simple toy that will give the child a great deal of amusement. Let the children fashion their own balls, and let them play with them. They will be ever so much interested in them, even at first, they are not just a game, but a game that will begin with one of the articles above.

AVIATOR KEEPS FLIES FROM KEY WEST TO A POINT TEN MILES FROM HAVANA.

**SHIRT OF OIL HE DESCENDS**

Peat in Failure When Success is in Sight and Success is in Sight.  
Over-Water Flight on Record—Loss \$2000. Price.

Havana, Cuba.—J. A. D. McCurdy yesterday afternoon pointed out that he has crossed the Florida channel from Key West to Havana Island. In his Carlin airplane he covered all miles of the distance and then was forced to descend, two miles from Havana, by shortage in his supply of lubricating oil.

When he saw that he could not reach the port McCurdy alighted safely on the waters and the engine with which it was equipped burned the airplane until the destroyer Panther, speaking along in its wake, had overpowered the aerial flyer. McCurdy and his airplane were taken on board, neither the worse for the mishap.

At first it was believed that the aviator could have been saved by the deck of the destroyer, but this proved impractical after the aviator was able to descend. The landing brought the whole outfit to the harbor.

McCurdy had covered approximately 90 miles of the distance of 110 to Havana when he was obliged to descend and though he failed to meet the requirements of the competition, he accomplished a feat unprecedented in cross sea flying.

Compared with the 18 mile flight across the English channel, his performance was quite remarkable. But for a slip in taking fuel on the water, it is not doubted that the trip would have been successful. The flight of the bird man was interrupted in fact by the accident which occurred at each stage of the trip.

The money offered for the aerial voyage included \$5,000 secured by McCurdy made the start from Key West at 7:30 o'clock under the most favorable conditions after a week of preparatory flying.

It is estimated that fully 10,000 people saw the start. McCurdy first started at an elevation of 100 feet. He made a second circuit at an elevation of 200 feet, and then the flag dropped and the aviator crashed into the water at the end of his flight, not going at the rate of nearly sixty feet an hour.
