That the late H. O. Haverager, president of the Haverager Building company, exercised control over the company while owning only 10 per cent of the stock, valued at \$100,000 out of a total of \$900,000, was the statement made before the house investigating committee at Washington, D. C., on Monday, following a visit to the presidential residence by the late Haverager and his wife, Mrs. Haverager.
