 IN TOWNS.
 Representatives of "Orion," Pennsylvania has introduced in the House of Representatives a bill providing for the experimental establishment of a mail delivery and collection service in towns of 1,000 population and over.

Business men and their organizations all over the country are interesting themselves in the project.

No letter carrier is employed in this town and the post office profits are spent elsewhere, while the business men suffer inconveniences and financial loss by being compelled to collect and deliver their own mail. The post masters at all presidential post offices should have competent carrier assistants. In the large cities free delivery is established, and the rural delivery has been given the country residents, but town people suffer unjust discrimination. Every progressive town council at once petition Congress for mail carrier service.

good fowling, and not the best of layers—the pullets often laying when five months old. They stand commendment in the winter and during their great activity, they are not so likely to give an independent and bowel troubles as the larger breeds. As the Leghorns are not so heavily feathered, they are more easily kept free from lice.

Now that we can catch and raise our own chickens, it is not the proper thing to have the "egg machines," or the laying breeds, also?

There are some noted strains of Plymouth Rocks and White Wyandottes that are heavy layers—strains built up by patient and painstaking work in selection and breeding from the best layers, so that they lay almost or quite as well as the Leghorns. The farmer has not the time to trap, net his hens and to secure his best layers. And what is the need of it, when it is just as natural for the Leghorn to lay as it is for the Jersey cow?

One hundred Leghorns can be kept on the feed and in the same amount of space required for 75 Plymouth Rocks, and I am sure the Leghorns will give a better return in money. Anyone with a decided preference for a particular breed of fowling, as he would enjoy them more and take better care of them than of any other breed. After experimenting with several breeds, the Leghorns are my choice, and I have told you why.

HANDY FOR POULTRY RAISERS
 Little Device for Carrying Eggs May Be Made out of Ordinary Lead

Here is a device for carrying eggs where they are delivered to customers in the city, writes A. J. Magee in the Farm and Poultry. It is made of ordinary plastering plaid placed moist and laid together with small nails. Two strips are nailed together in W shape for each corner. The bottom is made of tins board nailed to narrow strips on the inside of each side. The whole piece of wood as a handle. The carrier can be made to hold any number of eggs in a container that can be carried on one's feet to carry.

Winter Feed for Poultry.
 One of the best and most reliable winter foods for poultry is cabbage leaves, though there is an abundance of other green vegetable matter, which should strive to add some cabbage to the list. It is true that there is a great deal of food to be had in a green crop, such as rye, over which the birds can be allowed to graze, but this is not a good plan, as the cabbage leaves, with food getting, and every effort should be made to provide the birds with a good winter feed, and such crops and dependant must be fed in accordance with a substitute that can be stored away.
 Look After Growing Chickens.
 The welfare of chickens must be looked after during the growing period, as no amount of pampering and feeding can substitute with compensation for neglect them.
