# EPITOME OF A WEEK'S NEWS

Most Important Happenings Told in Brief.

## Washington

On a scale never before undertaken by the prominent men of the country, president of the Industrial Peace and Progress Association, disclosed at the twelfth annual convention of the National Education Association, held in three days' session at Washington.

Giris and boys, striking mill workers from Lawrence, Mass., testified before the Senate Committee on Education which is considering a resolution to investigate conditions which took to strike and to demand a settlement of the strike-ridden cities. They told of working for 40 hours a week and of paying the American Workers' com-pain five cents a week for drinking water, which they described as "milk water."

President Taft has taken the initiative in a movement to bring into existence a national convention on which the government for advice and counsel in the framing of a national code of new statutes and the development of comment.
