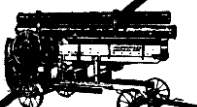

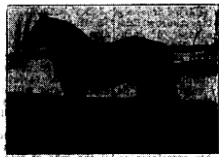

LORIMER WANTS CONTROL OF COOK COUNTY

Regular Republican Candidates Ask Voters Support on Their Records Against Lorimer.

ilar to the transfer of real property, which has meant a saving of thousands of dollars to the people.

These two laws are among some of the most important legislation which has been passed in recent years to put a stop to the disregard of white slave traffic. For the passage of these laws Mr. Juul has won the admiration of leading reform organizations of our country.

He sent out of the Judiciary committee on a tie vote the bill which forever abolished the scandals in Cook County in connection with the feeding of prisoners.

CONSTITUTIVE LEGISLATION.—The law abolishing the contracts of army and boat bosses at Chicago for Illinois Naval Reserve. A law which provided multiple punishments between the two States, River and the upper basin of the Illinois and Michigan canal and the Sanitary District, for the same offense, and constant fighter for the deep waterway since the origin of the fight, and he served as a member of the Drafting Committee.

The law concerning townships, wholly within cities of more than one hundred thousand population.

The law abolishing the town governments in Chicago and for Mr. Juul's service in connection with the creation of small parks. This was the initial enabling act for the creation of small parks.

Mr. Juul also introduced the famous "Bastion Passover" Joint Resolution and for this act Mr. Juul has won the gratitude of those oppressed people as well as the admiration of every liberty loving citizen.

The above are but matters of record of the Illinois legislature and can be verified as easily as the facts in a most conclusive way to the efficiency, honesty and progressive spirit of a faithful public servant.

It is true that he has been re-elected for four consecutive terms as a senator from the Twenty-fifth District the heart of the West Side of Chicago and this fact should certainly be the best argument in his favor.
