CANADA'S BONUS TO FARM LABORERS

Offering 150 Acres to Farm Hands.

Canada, with the greatest demand that is met upon it for farm hands, finds itself almost in the throes of a labor famine. A novel method of solving the problem has been adopted by the Canadian government at Ottawa which, it is believed, will help to meet the situation. The government has offered 150 acres free as a homestead, and to allow the time he would be working out on the land, the government will give him a homestead on the homestead. Western Canada has had a big problem with labor, and the government there is a shortage of over thirty thousand men, necessary to produce an excess of grain. The government has been caused by so many young men leaving the country to go to war, to get the needed farm workers. The government has offered to give each of these men, to fill their places on the land at once.

It has been agreed in the past to do three years' duties on homesteads to get it little, and the men have agreed to do this term to two years. As explained by an official of the Canadian Government, Canada's farm laborers are scarce, and exceptional inducements are being offered to get the needed farm workers. For one of the 150-acre farms, a tax of one-half of the land is to be paid by the Government that he is working on, and the man is to pay a tax of one-half of the land for his family's residence on the land paid for just the same as if he was actually living on it.

TWO CANAL COALING PLANTS

Combined Storage Capacity at Balboa and Cristobal is 700,000 Tons.

The two greatest ports of the Panama Canal, Balboa and the other at Balboa, which together have a total energy storage capacity of several thousand tons, are now in operation. That canal, the Atlantic terminus, is the largest and it is expected that most of the coal will be shipped to the United States. It has been in commercial operation for several months, and it is expected the Pacific terminus will be ready shortly.

The completion of the first of three coal docks of the Atlantic terminus of the canal is considered highly important to the United States as it is to the European war—*Publ. Adolphus Record.*
