Hendon, county clerk at Waukegan, has been appointed exclusive licensing agent for Lake county and is authorized to issue licenses under "an act to prohibit the manufacture, distribution, storage, use and possession in times of war of explosives and providing for use regulation of handling same." The law provides that no person shall manufacture, use or sell explosives without having received a license. This law took effect November 15, 1917.

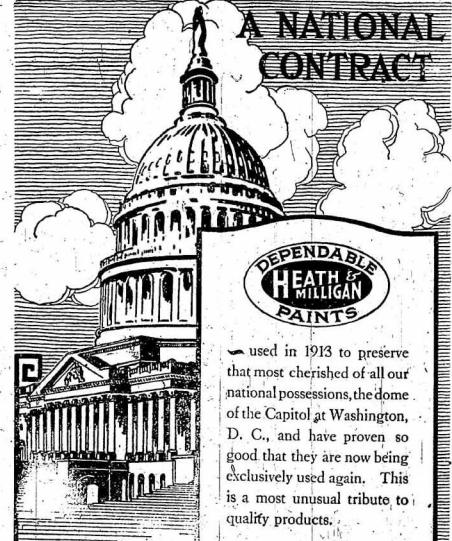
