## U. S. TAKES OVER ALL RAILROADS

President Wilson Assumes Control and Names McAdoo as Director General.

### ACTION TO SPEED WAR WORK

Roads Will Be Controlled by Present Officials but by One System—Control to Be Asked to Guarantee No Damage.

Washington, President Wilson has assumed control of the entire railway system of the country as a war measure. The railroad will be controlled and operated by the government, under direction of William C. McAdoo, secretary of the treasury.

Mr. McAdoo will take over the general direction of railways. In taking over the railways President Wilson has followed the plan already adopted in England. "The government will guarantee that it will receive no operating losses equal to the average net losses of the country for the year ending June 30, 1917." The president in his proclamation further states that the government will be responsible for the payment of the railroads that their liability will be guaranteed by the government.

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## President Tells Why He Was Forced to Take Over the Railroads.

I have exercised the powers over the transportation system of the country which were granted me by the act of congress of August 7, 1917, because it has become imperatively necessary for me to do so.
