Thrift stamps are to be left for the children. Adults are asked to consider whether smaller than the \$1 War Savings stamps. They ask you to buy these stamps five, ten, twenty, a hundred or up to two hundred at a time.

The buyer of twenty stamps becomes a member of the Illinois War Savings Certificate club. The club star is his engraved certificate. He got another year for every additional twenty stamps he buys.

His certificate, framed and preserved will be an answer, in years to come, to the question "What did you do to help win the great war?"

Purchase of 20 of the stamps makes the buyer a member of the Maximum War Savings club of Illinois. Two hundred stamps will net just \$24 in June and July, or worth \$1,900 on January 1, 1923. They may be redeemed at any time prior to maturity, and each stamp increases one cent in value for every month it is held.

There must be 10,000 persons in Illinois who are able to become members of the maximum club and 140,000 who could easily join the Maximum War Savings Certificate club. These must be rounded up by June.

"Buy the stamps now" is to be the slogan of the war savings workers. The Illinois in the lead. Go over the top for the U. S. A. or before June 28.
