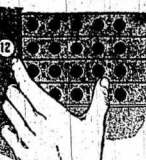

Calling Your Telephone Number



THIS drawing shows a small section of a telephone dial and serves to explain why there should be no pause between the hundreds and the tens.

No doubt you have noticed the way the telephone operator repeats the number you give her. For example, when you ask for "One-two-six-three," she repeats it "One-two-six-three," giving just a fraction of a second between the hundreds and the tens.

There is a reason for this practice: The switchboard behind the telephone operator is divided into hundreds of "banks," each of which is the terminal of a subscriber's line. These sections are in sections of 100 each.
