STUDENT-SOLDIERS AT UNIVERSITY

Continued from last page.

Instruments coming about \$31.

After they have been inducted into the R. A. T. C. students will receive their books and lodging from the Government, will have their uniforms furnished, will receive the pay of a private, \$10 a month, and will receive a rebill on one paid.

Terms of Admission.

Young men cannot enter the R. A. T. C. Army Training Corps in October in any way except by being registered students in a recognized college or university.

Students must meet the regular entrance requirements of the University, i. e., they must be graduates of high school according to the University, with French "inter" in acceptable subjects, including 3 A English, 1 in algebra, 1 in plane geometry, 1 in laboratory physics.

For further details in regard to these requirements see the regulations of the R. A. T. C. or write to the Registrar.

The first step of each prospective student should be to have the principal of the high school from which he graduated make out a detailed official statement of his high school credits on the blank which the University has furnished to all accepted high-school seniors, and send this statement to the Registrar of the University. The prospective student should also be informed of the standing for admission. If eligible, he will be sent a "permit" to join.

Students admitted to the University may, of course, be rejected for lack of sufficient preparation for the physical examination which will be conducted by army officers prior to the induction of the student into the service. It does not appear nearly be able to continue their studies, but will have to pay fees and their own expenses, just as all students do in ordinary times.

Students under 18 may be enrolled in the R. A. T. C. and inducted into its members of the U. S. Army, live in barracks, and receive the military training, but until they reach their eighteenth birthday and are inducted into the U. S. A. they must have \$5 per month and pay for their maintenance at the rate of \$1 a day, and will receive no wages from the Government. It is understood either way the Government will furnish uniforms for students under 18.

Government, Higher Education.

That the United States Government at the present need a program on the education of youths in general, rather than upon their own, is the result of the situation.

It is attested by the statement recently made by Colonel H. B. Glavin, the chairman of the committee on education and special training of the general staff, who is in charge of the organization of the Student Army Training Corps. He says:

"All young men who were planning to go to school this fall should carry out their plans and do so. Each should go to the college of his choice, be a student, and receive a regular education. He will, of course, also register with his local board on the registration day set by the President (Sept. 12). As soon as possible after registration day, probably on or about October first, opportunity will be given for all the regularly enrolled graduates to be inducted into the Student Army Training Corps at the schools where they are in attendance. Thus the corps will be organized by voluntary induction under the Selective Service Act, instead of by call-up as previously contemplated."

"The student, by voluntary induction, becomes a soldier in the United States Army, without subject to military discipline, and with the pay of a private (\$75 a month). He will automatically be placed on full active duty, and contracts will be made as soon as possible, with the colleges for the housing, subsistence, and instruction of the student soldier."

"Officers, uniforms, rifles, and such other equipment as may be available will be furnished by the War Department, as previously announced."

"The student-soldier will be given military instruction under officers of the Army and will be kept, under observation and test to determine his qualifications as an officer-candidate, and technical experts such as engineers, chemists, and doctors. After a certain period the men will be selected according to their performance, and assigned to military duty."

Costly Law Proceedings.

After the trial for ten years, it was put on and by being referred to arbitrators, was decided in favor of the defendant, who could, and ordered the plaintiff to pay all the costs incurred in the proceedings, which were assessed at \$1000—London, Tribune.

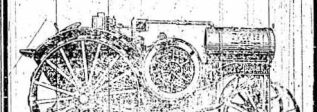
