COMPLETE PLANS FOR FOURTH LIBERTY LOAN

Barrington Making Early Start for Vigorous Campaign; to Raise \$10,000

Plans for launching the Fourth Liberty Loan are well under way in Barrington, a model town which held last night right at 7:15 the first of the three days of the campaign to start with every possible enthusiasm on Saturday of this week, Sept. 28.

More than forty business men and farmers were present at the meeting and the plan for the work was known to all. Mr. G. W. Spangler has selected his committee and given them notices to be prepared to do their work prominently on the first day. When the quota was agreed upon and your, money, and if you bought one bond last June, make it two this time, as the quota for Barrington is far larger than the \$10,000 for which it was the first year.

The fourth issue of Liberty bonds

will pay an interest rate of 4% and will be issued in four months. It offers an attractive investment because they are immune from federal taxation up to a purchase of \$30,000 worth of bonds. The first three issues of the country where sales saturation has been made indicate that the fourth issue will be a better seller. The quota for Barrington is high, all realize how essential it is that the soldiers in France and those in cun-
