A GRADE CROSSING.

This sign tells the driver that he is approaching a railroad and under the law must bring the speed of his machine to a standstill before proceeding over a railroad.

The quartered circular signs with the letter 'R' are to be used at a distance from the track, in order to give the driver ample time to slow down. If the crossing

is obscured or for some other reason is unusually hazardous, there is a "STOP" sign. Few feet from the crossing there should be a sign which reads "STOP" to indicate to an automobile to stop before proceeding over a railroad when there is one of these signs.
