HELPFUL ADVICE

ON TESTING CORN

Reports from over Northern Illinois indicate that seed corn this year is not of a high degree of reliability. A number of seed catalogs will receive letters soon indicating how the people in a particular section of the state. Every seedman will be asked to list at least a dozen.

Taking soil climate and an average corn into consideration, the local condition is that the low yield of corn is due to poor seed.

The bill of corn shown above presents a familiar scene throughout the corn belt. Three ears have been planted in this hill. One of them is a stalk, another an eight-ear corn, and the other produced a barren stalk, and the other produced nothing, as it failed to grow.

TEST YOUR CORN WILL GROW
TEST-DONT GUESS

Ear No. 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 10 are strong. Have ears like these for planting. They may have life in the case of No. 6, but when these kernels are planted they will produce a favorable result. At least six kernels from every ear of corn should be tested and the dead, weak ears discarded.

It should be remembered that planting some of the choicest ears together from which to select the best for following years. Corn should not be grown more than five years in succession upon the same soil.

A rotation of crops which has been used for many years has shown that corn should be followed.
