**VILLAGE BOONIA MEET THIS EVENING TO TALK PUMPING**

Outside of the transaction of routine business, the chief problem confronting the village trustees at their regular monthly meeting last Monday was the pumping of city water.

The contract with the Public Service Company, which was signed for pumping water, expired Aug. 1. The price paid under the contract was 5 cents for each 1,000 gallons. The commissioners to review the contract but it was not necessary to renew it for a piling at a fixed price for the current. The electrical machinery used in pumping water was owned entirely by the village for \$4,500.

LOCAL MAN HAS RECORD OF 30 YEARS AS A CANNER

W. W. Abbott, Expert Canning Factory Superintendent, Has First Record

W. W. Abbott of West Main street went to Houston yesterday and will return today or tomorrow. That city was his home for several years and he has been a resident of Houston for many more than 30 years.

The "Fair" newspaper, Aug. 1, 1919, reported Abbott, born in 1880, 800 bushels of wheat, the record of the county's annual production of them.

From 1,500,000 to 2,500,000 bushels of corn sets, or 90 per cent of all used in America, are produced by Abbott. Hundreds of sets of machinery are produced by him.

He is the largest canning factory in the world of Blue Island. That city has a large population, and Abbott determined to prevent him from returning to the industry. This summer, in his 30th year, he has been in the business, and he has not spent at least three years in a canning factory.

The "Fair" newspaper, Aug. 1, 1919, reported Abbott, will still continue, farmers specializing in everything from little of the valley and mist to bluebells, will be able to make a living.
