

Barrington Voting Today on New Tax for Aid of Schools

The vote will determine whether the Board of Education will be authorized to levy a high school tax not to exceed two per cent for educational purposes and not to exceed three

The Board of Education sent out early last week a form letter to Barrington voters as follows:

"A short time ago, we published in the 'Barrington Review' an article

giving the school tax rates of most of our surrounding communities to be maintaining high schools. At least three communities have either Community or Township high school organization, many of which comprise more than a whole township in area. The high school boards in these communities can levy 25% for high school purposes.

"In 1924, after authority granted by an election, we levied 3 1/2 % school tax. Since then we have built an addition to our school building and our enrollment has increased to such an extent that it was necessary to employ four teachers to our teaching staff."

In 1925, we levied the full 4% tax allowed by law.

"At the last regular Board Meeting, ninety parents of children in Kindergarten age petitioned the Board for a Kindergarten and petition was necessarily granted. We are also continually receiving requests from parents of our high school pupils asking that we include in our

Enrollment Will Increase

"Barrington seems to be at the beginning of a 'boom' and we are given there are now some forty or fifty new homes under construction. All the above means increased enrollment in our school and this in turn means

"In 1925, the legislature passed a bill to cover conditions as exist in the districts organized as our School District No. 4. This bill allows the

levy a tax for high school purposes not to exceed 2 1/2%. After due consideration, the Board of Education at a special meeting has decided to call an election on Thursday, Jan. 29th to give you an opportunity to grant the Board authority to levy above the outland.
