After the corn has been harvested, sort,  
starch and graded for the planter  
and then the seed is to be packed  
in half-lashed sacks and  
placed in a safe, separate from the rest  
of the corn, because from the rest  
of the corn, we will not use the seed from

the rest of the corn, we will use the seed from  
the field and plant it on one site  
of the field next year.

If we have good seed we  
should buy from our neighbors or some  
one who has good seed. We should not  
buy poor seed from outside our  
neighborhood. We should not buy  
individual seed tests to prove that  
any particular seed is good. We should  
buy good seed from a reliable source,  
from eight to 20 bushels of corn per  
acre that will support good  
yield. We should buy good seed  
and test every year intended for  
planting.
